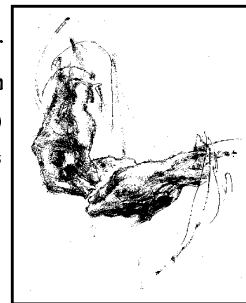

### Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent. Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

### Being Victorious—Reflections on the Coming of Lent

A NATIONWIDE COMMERCIAL CAMPAIGN for a well-known brand of cereal recently caught my attention. “**Be Victorious**” proclaims the value and virtue of eating wisely and well for the sake of good health and happiness. It is a positively attractive and encouraging commercial. It’s well designed to sell a product but also to help me—or you—to embrace the self-disciplines necessary for healthy living. To be victorious, I must **want** to be victorious. I liked the commercial and decided to make it my theme for Lent.

We must always begin Lent by remembering that everyone one of us is **called to holiness** and that fundamentally **holiness is about wholeness**. This simply means that when we’re considering our Lenten call to conversion we first remember this: ***There are more people everyday converting from bad to good, than there are from good to better or best.*** Moving toward better and best may not be as dramatic a conversion, but most of the time it’s harder than we think—in fact we don’t even often think about it. If I’m going to “**Be Victorious**”, I’m going to have to examine this more closely.

*Father, the loving plan of your wisdom took flesh in Jesus Christ,  
and changed our history by his command of perfect love.*

*May our fulfillment of his command reflect your wisdom*

*and bring your salvation to the ends of the Earth.*

*Opening Prayer for the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time*

It may help to consider that the “**wholeness**” of “holiness” means that for me to “**Be Victorious**” my **mind, heart, body, and soul** must be working together well. Questions like these point toward the real disciplines of Lent:

- *Is my **ignorance** about something causing difficulty in my life?*
- *Am I unhappy because of **emotional** difficulties? Heartaches?*
- *What different choices should I make to take care of myself **physically**?*
- *How do I acknowledge **God’s love for me** on a daily basis?*

Remember, Lent is also about God wanting to save the world through us.

#### By the grace of God

“Μακάριοι ” - “**Congratulations!**”

When someone is “**blessed**” the Greeks would mean that he or she is “**fortunate to be the recipient of divine favor**”. The word functions as a kind of congratulatory note meaning, “**Good job!**” We rejoice with the accomplishment of the other, which “enlarges” both of us and expresses something important about our relationship with each other.

With the beatitudes, Luke highlights God’s generosity. Blessedness isn’t a matter of social status, satisfaction, possessions, respect, or other such things. It is a matter of keeping our eyes glued on Jesus. Blessedness is not so much a promise as an after-the-fact statement of congratulations for the effort and success trusting in God in our everyday lives.

Scripture today invites and challenges us to “**want change**” and not simply “**watch change**”. As we do, we come to life. We are blessed.

*“Blessed is the one  
who trusts in the Lord, ...  
he is like a tree planted  
beside the waters  
that stretches out its roots  
to the stream.”*

*The Prophet Jeremiah 17:7*

#### Spiritual Exercise

Use Jeremiah’s image of “**stretching**” toward the water to reflect on how you might want to spend the time of Lent.

What change to you want?

What change does God want for you?

Jeremiah says that such “**stretching**” means “**no fear**” of heat or drought, and sureness that your life will always be green and fruitful.

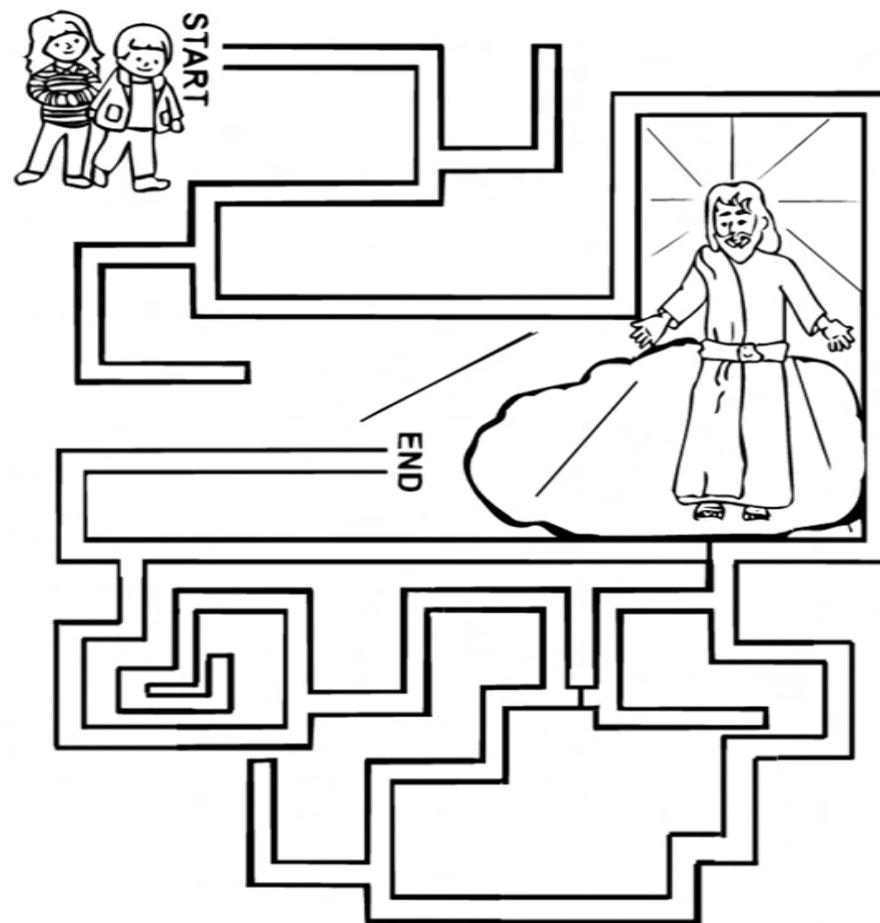


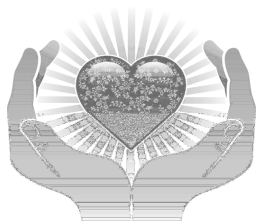

## SERMON ON THE MOUNT

What do these two have in common? We celebrate them both today.

When reflecting on these two occasions, it occurred to me that they are played out daily at Holy Name of Jesus. Here are a few examples:

- Joan and Jim Cuidon have graciously accepted the ministry of serving coffee and donuts every 1st Wednesday after the 8:00 a.m. Mass. Many thanks to them.
- Under the direction of 5 parishioners, Holy Name of Jesus Community provides over 100 casseroles or containers of soup, stew and chili to homeless.
- Each month, over 15 people make it possible for homeless to find shelter and warmth in our Parish Office.
- Because of the generosity of 20 drivers, over 30 of our parishioners are able to come to Mass each week-end.
- Because of one woman's love, all of our shut-ins receive a birthday card on their special day.
- 12 women, each Wednesday, meet to Quilt. The results help to bring revenue into our parish.
- 6 women meet every Thursday evening to knit or crochet prayer shawls that are then blest and given to our sick and dying parishioners. These women bring comfort and a promise of God's love through these shawls.
- 17 "scribes" are responsible for sending out 157 cards to our shut-ins every 6 weeks.
- Over 150 shut-ins have the privilege of receiving Communion each week, because of the love of over 40 of our parishioners.
- 4 of our parishioners make it possible for Doctor's appointments to be kept, and in some cases, groceries or medication, obtained.

These are just a few of the many ways that make everyday a Valentine's Day and the Sermon on the Mount a reality in our Community. If you feel like you would like to be part of any of these ministries, please do not hesitate to call and volunteer.

TO CHRIST'S FAITHFUL OF THE ARCHDIOCESE OF ST. LOUIS:

**ON THE OBSERVANCE OF THE HOLY SEASON OF LENT**

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

On this coming February 17, Ash Wednesday, we begin our annual observance of the Season of Lent, a time most strong in grace for our daily living in Christ. It is a time of annual retreat for the universal Church, when all of us who have come to life in Christ through Baptism accompany our Lord into the desert for 40 days to fast and pray, in order that we, with Him, may give ourselves more completely to doing the will of God the Father in all things.


The threefold practice of prayer, fasting and almsgiving is the heart of the Lenten observance, for it is directed to the purification of our minds and hearts in a more Christlike life. The imposition of blessed ashes on our forehead at the beginning of Lent signifies the purification of our minds and hearts, which is the fruit of our Lenten observance.

Surely, we cannot doubt our spiritual need of the 40 days of Lent. We struggle in our personal lives to overcome sinful inclinations and to follow Christ with integrity of mind and heart. What is more, we live in a culture which demands ever greater courage in giving witness to Christ in the world. I urge you to adopt a Lenten plan of prayer, fasting and almsgiving, which is realistic for your state of life and which will truly open your mind and heart more completely to Christ. Remember the words of the Archangel Raphael to Tobias: "Prayer is good when accompanied by fasting, almsgiving, and righteousness. A little with righteousness is better than much with wrongdoing" (*Tob* 12:8). Make the Sacraments of the Holy Eucharist and of Penance the mainstays of your Lenten observance. They will inspire and fortify your prayer and your works of penance and almsgiving.

Attached to this letter are the Archdiocesan Directives for the Blessing and Distribution of Ashes on Ash Wednesday, as well as the Archdiocesan Lenten Regulations regarding the days of fast and abstinence.

I invoke God's blessing upon you and your home, with the prayer that God will bless abundantly your observance of the holy Season of Lent.

**ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS**

Then to all Christ said, "Whoever wishes to be my follower must deny his very self, take up his cross each day, and follow in my steps" (Lk 9:23).

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics. Accordingly, the Pope and the American bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

**Ash Wednesday (February 17, 2010) and Good Friday (April 2, 2010)** are days of *abstinence* for all Catholics *over the age of 14*. On these two days, *fast* as well as abstinence is also obligatory for those *from the ages of 18 to 59*. Abstinence means abstinence from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

**All other Fridays of Lent** are days of *abstinence* from meat. Here again Catholics will not hold themselves lightly excused, but if there is a serious health problem, this obligation would not apply.

We should strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer and penance.
