

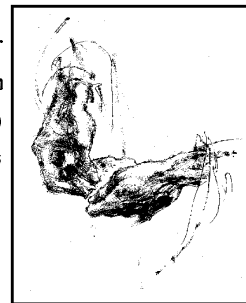

If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

### Can You Imagine ...

#### Going to Confession Like a Second Grader

**A**S A PRIEST SOME OF MY BEST TEACHERS have been my students. Once I was preparing a class of second graders for their first celebration of the Sacrament of Penance. Out of curiosity I decided to explore their understanding of the word **“confession”**. What does a 7 or 8 year old child **mean** when she or he uses this word? In their ordinary daily lives how do children put this word into **practice**?

The first child I called on for a definition responded, **“That’s when you tell the truth about yourself.”** Good answer! Something I could work with and more than I was expecting. Impressive! But then, almost immediately, someone from the back of the room shouted out another answer, **“No! That’s when you tell the whole truth about yourself.”** There was such sureness in her voice that I imagined the unspoken ending of **“so help me God”**. It was a cute, but also curious response. A few days later I came to realize it might even have been the better way of thinking about this word.

*Lord, our God, you formed us from the clay of the Earth and breathed into us the spirit of life ... bring us back to you and to the life your Son won for us.*

*From the Opening Prayer for the First Sunday of Lent*

Christians, especially Catholics, have always had two kinds of **“confession”** — **“of sin”** and **“of faith”**. Talking about both is what **“telling the whole truth about yourself”** really means. We are—all of us—not just tales of sinfulness, but also of grace. So if you want to make a good confession, take the advice of a second grader —

- Ask the priest for a blessing to know what to say and how to say it.  
(Before going on STOP and listen to the prayer he will offer for you and your “confession”.)
- Talk about your sins, especially how you most want God’s help in your life.
- Talk about your faith—what the grace of God is doing in your life.  
(Don’t wait for him to ask. Just continue on with the “whole truth about yourself”.)
- Make your Act of Contrition and listen to the prayer of Absolution.
- Do your penance as a sign of your contrition and love for God.



**B**eing Victorious this Lent means remembering that the **“wholeness”** of **“holiness”** for me may be about how well my **mind, heart, body, and soul** are working together. Questions like these point toward the real disciplines of Lent and how God wants to use each us as the light of the world:

- *Is my **ignorance** about something causing difficulty in my life?*
- *Am I unhappy because of **emotional** difficulties? Heartaches?*
- *What different choices should I make to take care of myself **physically**?*
- *How do I acknowledge **God’s love for me** on a daily basis?*

#### By the grace of God

#### Never Doubting the Truth

**T**emptations are tricky. They always pull us toward something desirable; but at the same time away from something better. The desirable tempts us to doubt the a greater good. Satan tempts Jesus to doubt—and therefore misuse—the truth of who he is, **“Son of God”**. I think in a similar way each of us is tempted to doubt these **truest things** about ourselves:

- I am created in the image and likeness of God.
- We are the light of the world.

## WHAT'S FOR DINNER?

Have you ever opened a magazine to an article proclaiming a particular food to be the new miracle food? Or heard a radio announcement stating a certain food can help you lose weight? Or have you seen on a shopping channel a miracle pill that rids you of your abdominal fat without exercise or diet? The thing is, many of these "miracle foods" or so called "miracle pills" do have nutrients and chemicals that interact with cells and chemicals in our own body that do promote fat burning, or tissue healing and even improved memory loss.

Nutrition science is unlocking amazing insights into how the foods we eat can affect individual body chemistry—including cognition. But seeking out the "miracle shake" or "miracle juice" is not the answer. But you will probably find greater success in making nutritional tweaks in your own diet, as well as that of your loved ones.

### Brain-health foods....

- **Blueberries**----the concentration of phytochemicals with antioxidants and anti-inflammatory effects cross the blood-brain barrier and can significantly improve word association and list recall.
- **Leafy greens**----rich in B-vitamins and rich in antioxidants, which helps overall brain health.
- **Wild-caught salmon**----this oily fish contains the highest concentration of the component in omega-3 fatty acids known as DHA.
- **Curcumin**----found in the yellow spice turmeric, it has an anti-inflammatory effect.

Incorporating these foods into our diets, and our loved one's diets can help us to remain sharp and brain healthy. As we nourish our brain, let us also nourish our souls! Pray the Rosary!

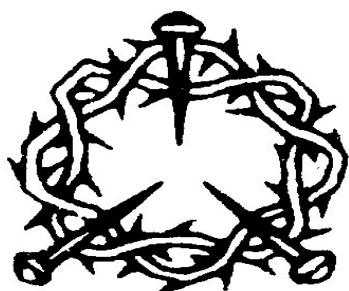
**Did you know?**
