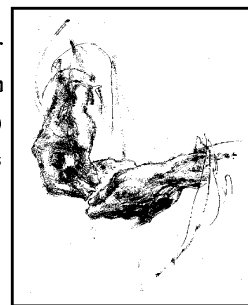

### Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding.

Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

### Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

### Can You Imagine ...

#### Being Convicted for Something You Didn't Do

Being Christian doesn't make sense. However, it does make saints. On five occasions in Luke's passion account Jesus is declared innocent – three times by Pilate, once by the Good Thief, and once by the Centurion at the foot of the cross. Jesus died not because of guilt, but because of his infinitely compassionate love for us. As Paul writes, his compassion was so total that he willingly emptied himself “to the point of death”. The power of Jesus' innocence and compassion is an invitation and a challenge for us. Our **necessary obedience to this mystery** celebrates the promise of salvation and new life for saints and sinners everywhere.

*Today we come together to begin the celebration  
of the Lord's paschal mystery with the whole Church throughout the world.  
Let us remember and follow him with a lively faith.  
United with him in his suffering on the cross,  
may we share his resurrection and new life.*

*(Introduction, Palm Sunday Liturgy)*

### By the Grace of God ...

#### Believing a Mystery Without Fear

As we grow older we often have a better knowledge of what's good for us and greater confidence about listening to others, especially when we know and trust their love for us. If we measure ‘growing up’ by the standards of wisdom, good judgment, and courage, we discover it's a **life-long calling** and a **challenge** well worth celebrating every day.

*There is a certain wisdom among the spiritually mature,  
not of this age, mysterious, hidden, planned before all ages for our glory,  
of this wisdom it is written:*

*“Eye has not seen, ear has not heard, nor has it so much as dawned on man  
what God has ready for those who love him.”*

*Yet God has revealed this wisdom to us through the Holy Spirit.*

*(1<sup>st</sup> Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians 2:6-9)*

Maggie's parents had a plan for helping her overcome her fear of full-time school. After hours of careful conversation even her seven year old judgment thought it was worth trying. At least it might be an alternative for what seemed to be her only other choice – running away from home. For the first week her mother promised that she would walk her right to her desk before saying, “Good bye!” Everything new along the way they would face together. Everything expected of her would become familiar for them both. The following week they would say their ‘good byes’ at the front door of school – a plan that actually worked, but only because of their longer than planned hugs for each other. Secretly they both wondered if it was the right thing to do. The final step would be for Maggie to enter school for the day from the parking lot. Near the end of the week she grabbed her mother's arm before opening the car door and said, “**When did we ever agree that this would be good for me?**” Somewhat ironically within a couple of years Maggie was walking to school from home on her own and with friends.

I encourage everyone to take advantage of the **careful conversations with God** that will be yours and ours during **Holy Week**. The scriptures, prayers, and liturgies of this week have been passed down to us as our way of **knowing God is with us** every step of the way of our lives. The more we do, the more we **experience a new freedom from fear and confidence for living our faith.**

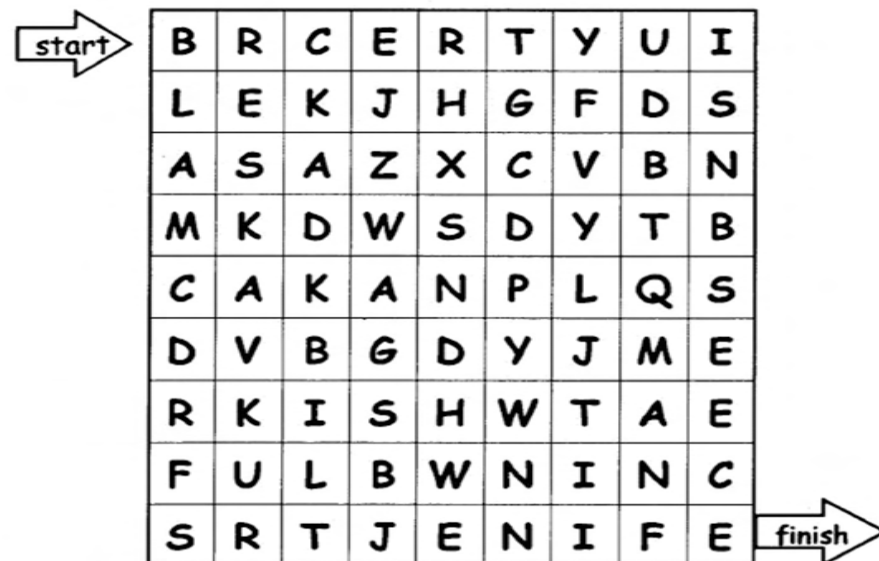

## THE MIRACLE OF PEROXIDE

Here are some wonderful uses for a very inexpensive solution. (Hydrogen peroxide)

- Take one cap full and hold in your mouth for 10 minutes daily, then spit it out. Your teeth will be whiter without expensive pastes.
- Clean your counters and table tops with peroxide to kill germs and leave a fresh smell. Simply put a little on your dishcloth when you wipe, or spray counters.
- After rinsing off your wooden cutting board, pour peroxide on it to kill salmonella and other bacteria.
- Soak any infections or cuts in peroxide for 5-10 minutes several times a day.
- Fill a spray bottle with a 50/50 mixture of peroxide and water and keep it in every bathroom to disinfect.
- If you have a terrible toothache and cannot get to a dentist right away, put a capful of peroxide into your mouth and hold it for 10 minutes several times a day.
- And of course, if you like a natural look to your hair, spray the 50/50 solution on your wet hair after a shower and comb it through. You will not have the peroxide-burnt blonde hair like the dye packages but more natural highlights if your hair is a light brown or dirty blonde. It also lightens gradually, so it's not a drastic change.
- You can also add a cup of peroxide instead of bleach to a load of whites in your laundry. If there is a stain, pour it directly on the soiled spot. Let it sit for a minute, then rub it and rinse with cold water.
- Use peroxide to clean mirrors. There is no smearing.
