Being Convicted for Something You Didn't Do

Being Christian doesn't make sense. However, it does make saints. On five occasions in Luke's passion account Jesus is declared innocent – three times by Pilate, once by the Good Thief, and once by the Centurion at the foot of the cross. Jesus died not because of guilt, but because of his infinitely compassionate love for us. As Paul writes, his compassion was so total that he willingly emptied himself "to the point of death". The power of Jesus' innocence and compassion is an invitation and a challenge for us. Our necessary obedience to this mystery celebrates the promise of salvation and new life for saints and sinners everywhere.

Today we come together to begin the celebration of the Lord's paschal mystery with the whole Church throughout the world.

Let us remember and follow him with a lively faith.

United with him in his suffering on the cross,

may we share his resurrection and new life.

(Introduction, Palm Sunday Liturgy)

By the Grace of God ... Believing a Mystery Without Fear

As we grow older we often have a better knowledge of what's good for us and greater confidence about listening to others, especially when we know and trust their love for us. If we measure 'growing up' by the standards of wisdom, good judgment, and courage, we discover it's a life-long calling and a challenge well worth celebrating every day.

There is a certain wisdom among the spiritually mature, not of this age, mysterious, hidden, planned before all ages for our glory, of this wisdom it is written:

"Eye has not seen, ear has not heard, nor has it so much as dawned on man what God has ready for those who love him."

Yet God has **revealed** this wisdom to us through the Holy Spirit.

(1st Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians 2:6-9)

Maggie's parents had a plan for helping her overcome her fear of full-time school. After hours of careful conversation even her seven year old judgment thought it was worth trying. At least it might be an alternative for what seemed to be her only other choice – running away from home. For the first week her mother promised that she would walk her right to her desk before saying, "Good bye!" Everything new along the way they would face together. Everything expected of her would become familiar for them both. The following week they would say their 'good byes' at the front door of school – a plan that actually worked, but only because of their longer than planned hugs for each other. Secretly they both wondered if it was the right thing to do. The final step would be for Maggie to enter school for the day from the parking lot. Near the end of the week she grabbed her mother's arm before opening the car door and said, "When did we ever agree that this would be good for me?" Somewhat ironically within a couple of years Maggie was walking to school from home on her own and with friends.

I encourage everyone to take advantage of the careful conversations with God that will be yours and ours during Holy Week. The scriptures, prayers, and liturgies of this week have been passed down to us as our way of knowing God is with us every step of the way of our lives. The more we do, the more we experience a new freedom from fear and confidence for living our faith.

THE MIRACLE OF PEROXIDE
