

Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.



CHARTER CHANGES EWTN TO CHANNEL 152 DIGITAL

You will no longer be able to get EWTN on Charter channel #25 because they have moved it to a digital channel #152. If you have an analog TV you will need to install a converter box (from digital to analog). Charter will provide a converter box for \$5 per month. If you have a HD or Digital TV you may find EWTN on channel 106-9.

A number of parishioners (in this and other parishes) have suggested sending a petition to Charter to have this change reversed, but based on discussions with the EWTN Regional Manager and people who have worked for Charter we will not be able to get this change reversed because they are headed for all digital like their

competition. They have already made the same change in other states and attempts to get it reversed in those states were unsuccessful.

If you call charter to have the converter box installed try to negotiate a lower rate. Some, including myself, have been successful in getting a reduced rate for six months.



Social Justice News

Please oppose SCS SJR 29. This legislation would tax **Catholic parishes** and schools and **Catholic Charities** agencies. The elderly on fixed income would have to pay sales tax for their **prescription drugs**. The poor would pay the tax when making their rent payments and when purchasing basic necessities like food, clothing, utilities, and prescription drugs. Major tax reform should be preceded by a thorough and unbiased study, which has not occurred in regards to SCS SJR 29.
