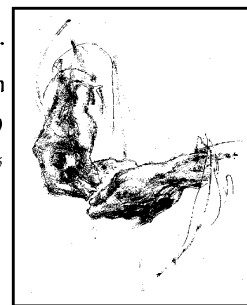

### Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding.

Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

### Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

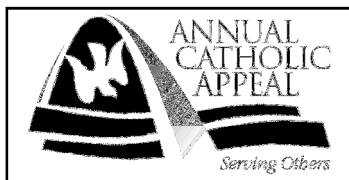

He knew that when their celebrations of the Eucharist centered on **giving thanks to God** and when their **daily lives focused on giving of self** they would know his **real presence** with them always. Our **Annual Catholic Appeal** this year invites us to do the same.

The Appeal is rooted in our **CATHOLIC TRADITION** of mutual support and reaching out with generosity to those in need. We unite with all Catholic throughout the Archdiocese in a common mission of service. Your **PARTICIPATION** makes a powerful statement of support for all that is good about our Church and our parish. It is **AN ACT OF FAITH** on our part that the power of love is more powerful than any painful circumstance or difficulty in life. It is an expression of **STEWARDSHIP**, a convincing evidence that there is a God who cares.

*All contributions to the Annual Catholic Appeal have already been designated and are restricted for Education, Pastoral Programs, and Charitable Services and Ministries that assist our parish and people throughout the community.*

Our parish received \$71,738 for our school during the 2008-2009 school year. Last year our confirmation students participated in a **REAP Team Retreat** and the **Right START Program** on chastity and the sanctity of human life was offered for students and parents of our school through the generous support of Catholics from every parish of the Archdiocese.

The goals for the Appeal in our parish this year are—

- To raise **\$53,026** in gifts and pledges
- To increase participation by **50 new donors** who have never given to the Appeal or did not contribute last year
- To maintain if not increase the **amount given last year** by each family or individual parish member

Remember to **prayerfully consider** how much easier it is to **remain a donor** or to **increase your donation** by **pledging your gift** over several payments.

*Pray daily that God will help us to believe in the importance of what we are doing and to experience how our generosity is a blessing on others.*

You can make your gift or pledge **before or after any Mass this weekend**, or when you come to church **for the next two weekends**. Please be as generous as possible. Please encourage your friends, neighbors, and family members to participate in the Appeal.

**DURING THE COMING WEEKS** I am trying to recruit and train some **new volunteer leaders** for both our **Fall Festival and Homecoming** and for our monthly **Sunday Hospitality Program**. Both activities bring our parish members together and are important ways we have for making our community more aware of our presence in the neighborhood. **We need to do all that is possible to continue these most important aspects of our parish life.** If you are interested in serving our parish, if you would like more information, or if you know someone who would do a good job coordinating and organizing the work of these activities, please let me know as soon as possible. I am hoping to form **core leadership teams of 2 to 4 persons** for each of these activities and for the other volunteers who make them possible.

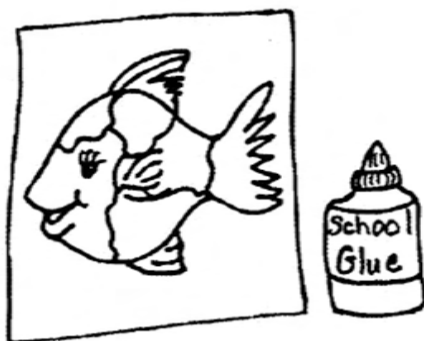

## WAYS TO BE GOOD TO YOUR JOINTS BEYOND EXERCISE—PART 2

Two weeks ago, we talked about being good to our joints beyond exercise. Our goal is to make everyday activities easier on our joints so we can remain active, and not be afraid to do something in fear that it will hurt. Here are a few more tips to make everyday living a little easier.

1. **The majority of our work today is done on the computer, which can cause neck pains. In order to prevent neck pain, your upper body should be spaced 20 to 26 inches from your computer monitor, and make sure to keep the top of your computer level with the top of your head. Have your arms hang comfortably at your sides, with your elbows at a right angle, and your wrists relaxed while typing.**
2. **How many times have we heard this one. Try and lose weight. You won't just look better, but you'll also feel better. Every extra pound you gain puts four times the stress on your knees. Research has shown that losing as little as 11 pounds may cut your risk of osteoarthritis of the knee by 50 percent.**
3. **Make healthier food choices. One of the ways to do this is to boost your calcium intake, because a diet rich in calcium helps to keep your bones sturdy and can lower your risk of osteoporosis. There are plenty of calcium sources besides milk, including yogurt, broccoli, kale, figs, salmon and calcium supplements.**
4. **Try massages, ice and heat. Massages are a great way to relieve tense muscles and reduce fatigue. You can even use anti-inflammatory creams on occasion when your joints are sore. To alleviate pain and swelling, apply ice packs or cold compresses to the joints. Heat is best for alleviating pain and stiffness; try a warm bath or a microwavable heat pack to help the joints.**

These are just a few tips that can help you adjust your lifestyle to live a better life with your arthritis. And don't forget Monday mornings in the community center, what better way to get your week going.
