Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.





KEEPING FIT....OR AT LEAST TRYING TO GET THERE.

No matter what our age or fitness level, physical activity will improve your health. The easiest and most popular form of exercise is walking. Walking can be done outdoors, indoors, in malls, around your house, etc. Here are some walking tips:

- East into your walk. Pick up speed gradually as you get used to the exertion.
- Drink water before and after your walk. If you walk more than 15 minutes, or its hot, brink water along and sip while you walk.
- Posture matters. Focus on the horizon.
- Keep your shoulders back, and tuck in your tummy to avoid arching lower back.
- Look ahead, not down at the ground.
- Swing your arms, with elbows bent up to a 90 degree angle. Keep your elbows fixed.
- Walk as fast as feels comfortable. You should be able to carry on a conversation while walking. If you're too breathless to talk you're going too fast.
- Take easy strides, not too long. Your stride will lengthen as you pick up speed, but don't force yourself to take longer steps.
- Push off with your back foot for power.
- Slow down a few minutes before you finish. This is your cool down period.
- Gently stretch after walking.
