

Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

A faith formation program for adults designed to develop a sense of friendship and camaraderie among neighbors

Recently Father Jim Mitulski (St. Norbert's Parish) invited all the pastors of the Deanery to consider learning more about the Neighborhood Church **Community Movement** and to invite their parish members to consider how important this movement might be for the Catholic Church in North County. For over a year now small groups have been meeting in the homes of their parish to pray, to share their faith, and to discuss ways of serving others. The purpose of the groups is to "encourage lay people to build up their gifts and to build up the Kingdom of God".

"We don't want to just be Sunday Catholics, we want our faith to be alive every day. The group is all about reawakening the spirit of neighborhood and the spirit of Christ".



PREVENTING FOOT PAIN:

Some steps to help prevent foot pain which isn't normal.

When it comes to feet, Americans seems to think pain is normal. More than half complain of heel pain. Others cry "Ouch" because of blisters, corns, pinched nerves, and ingrown toenails. There are some age-related changes in our feet that can make pain more likely. But painful feet aren't inevitable with age. Here are some simple steps to help prevent that pain:

• BE AWARE OF GOOD HYGIENE.

Feet are easy to ignore, especially in cooler months when they're often in closed-toe shoes. Be sure to cut toenails straight across to avoid ingrown nails.

Moisturize dry skin on the foot when it's cracked to keep feet comfortable and to help ward off infections when bacteria enter through cracked skin.

• BE ALERT TO AGE RELATED CHANGES.

Expect your foot to change as the years go by. Although the timing varies from person to person, changes in the 40's and 50's are typical. With age, we lose some of our fat pads and cushioning. That might mean wearing sturdier shoes. Foot size can change as you get older. Generally feet get longer and wider as the tendons loosen.

WEAR SHOES THAT MATCH YOUR ACTIVITY

When trying on shoes, be sure they are not too tight in the toe. Otherwise your feet will be squeezed and uncomfortable. If buying athletic shoes for walking, running, or other workouts, but the appropriate shoe for the activity. Walking shoes have different features than do running shoes.

• GIVE YOUR ARCHES THE SUPPORT DESERVED

How can you tell, besides eyeballing your foot and guessing whether your arch is flat, high, or normal? Take a brown paper bag, wet your foot, and put your foot down on it. If you see just the heel and the toes and a big gap, you have a high arch. If you see a wide footprint, all filled in, your foot is probably flat, and needs more support than other types of arches.

• RECONSIDER THE STILETTOS AND FLIP-FLOPS. Women's shoes with heels that are 3, 4, or more inches may look glamorous but they're not smart choices. Take a moderate road and use the 2 inch heels. It will help pain, as well as your back.

Regarding flip-flops,: be sure that you wear styles with built-in arch support.

• PICK YOUR BAREFOOT MOMENTS.

When in the warmth of your home in winter, or on a summer day, it's tempting to shuck your shoes and socks. This is fine as long as you are walking in a clean environment and don't have open sores on your feet.

Resident Openings at Little Sisters of the Poor



Report of the Renovation Committee

Our parish is called to be a Eucharistic Community. In a survey (April 2008) in which 471 parishioners participated, strong support was indicated for a review of the design of the church building to enhance worship, to create a space for fellowship and to increase accessibility for those with physical challenges.

The Renovation Committee was formed and accepted the mantra as

stated above—and their study began. The Committee continues to keep our congregation informed of their progress through the church bulletins.

At the Committee meeting on April 26, a proposed time line was presented and priorities for the project were developed. Archbishop Carlson has given his approval for continuing our study and planning for the renovation. The Committee will be working closely with Monsignor Vernon Gardin the Vicar General of the Archdiocese and Monsignor William McCumber from the Office of Worship.

When the Committee meets in May, questions will be developed appropriate for the interviews with three architectural applicants chosen from the Archdiocesan approved list. Should none of these candidates be selected, the Committee will select additional interviewees from the list and continue the interviewing process.

Hopefully, the Committee will have chosen the architect for our renovation sometime in June. At that time conceptual drawings, designs, floor plans and other proposals will be requested from the chosen architect.

Archbishop Carlson will be visiting our parish on June 24.

In August the Committee will schedule a meeting of the Summit of Parish Leaders. This includes the pastoral Council, the Finance Committee, the Pastoral Leadership Team,. The Liturgy Committee and the Capital Improvement Committee. Your input is always welcome.

The Renovation Committee has prayed, discussed, studied, reported, compromised, evaluated and proposed as plans are developing for renovation of our church. Working as a Committee—blessed with dedicated leadership-we prayerfully continue our efforts to strengthen our Community of Worship.
