C LEVERLY, FROM OUT OF NO WHERE, St. Luke uses King Herod, a man of little or no faith, to ask today's critical Gospel question: "Who is this man about whom I hear such things?" (Luke 9:9) Many paid attention to Jesus' teaching, were

in wonder of his power over nature, and sought physical and spiritual healings. All of which also left Herod "very curious to see Jesus". (Luke 9:9) This key question tells us what to look for in the most familiar story of the multiplication of the loaves and fish: the true identity and mission of Jesus. Herod's question and curiosity are elements of everyone's spiritual life!

Early in the story we also discover

what might be called the Apostles' question, unspoken, but definitely written between the lines: How can we do this? as Jesus clearly commands them, "Give them some food yourselves." (Luke 9:13) In calling the Apostles and Herod to eternal life, we now learn something important about our own identity and mission. We are the way, the instrument, by which God intends to call all peoples to the fullness of life now and forever. As with the Apostles, even for Herod, only one thing is required: practice, that we rehearse now for the reign of God.

This is why I have been asking the leaders of our parish to take a careful look at how our parish is organized. In a sense by asking Herod's question we can refresh our understanding of who Jesus is and why he lived among us. And by asking the Apostles' question we can remember why we are here as a parish.

#### **CHARITY**

Love is an extraordinary force which leads people to opt for courageous and generous engagement in the field of justice and peace. It gives real substance to the personal relationships with God and neighbor; with friends, family, and small groups; but also social, economic, and political relationships.

During May I met with our Parish Pastoral Council and Finance Committee to begin these discussions. This week I will be meeting with our Pastoral Leadership Team to explore with them too some first steps we might take to better organize our parish for the future. I ask and encourage everyone to pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit in these "holy conversations".

"To love someone is to desire that person's good and to take effective steps to secure it. Besides the good of the individual, there is the good that is linked to living in society: the common good. It is the good of 'all of us'. It paves the way for eternity through temporal action."

I would also like to announce today that the last formal meeting of our Parish Pastoral Council will take place on Tuesday, June 22nd. This group has generously served our parish for the past four years. They have graciously agreed to met with me in the coming year whenever I might need their advice. Please join me in thanking them for their service and in prayer that they—and our parish—will always know the blessing of the time they have given.



#### WASHING IS A GOOD THING

The season for fresh fruits and vegetables is here. Is there anything better then fresh garden tomatoes, or sweet strawberries? Have you wondered how much you should wash them before eating them? Here are some produce safety guidelines that are provided by Foodsafety.gov:.

- Take 20 seconds to wash hands with warm water and soap before and after preparing fresh produce.
- Wash fruits and vegetables under running water just before eating, cutting or cooking.
- Clean running water is all you need when washing produce; don't worry about using soap or other chemicals.
- Scrub melons, cucumbers and other firm produce with a clean produce brush.
- It's important to wash all fruits and veggies, even if you plan to peel them before eating. You don't want the knife to drag germs and bacteria from the rind into the food's flesh.
- Use a clean cloth towel or paper towel to dry produce.
