

Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.



WHY DID
THE SINFUL

WOMAN of today's Gospel come to Jesus with such an out-pouring of love? Could it have been that she saw her better, even best, self through her encounter with Jesus? That she could "be more" than the

the simple sum of her personal failures or difficult circumstances. What was it about Jesus that made him so attractive to her? What does this Gospel reveal about the kind of Church or parish we ought to be? Do sinners find us attractive? A good place to come? Good people to be with? Do we see people pouring out "great love" after they've experienced parish life here?

The idea of a world without development indicates a lack of trust in man (human beings) and in God.

It is therefore a serious mistake to undervalue human capacity to exercise control over the deviations of development or to overlook the fact that man (human beings) is constitutionally oriented toward 'being more'.

From the teachings of Pope Paul VI, 1967

My favorite definition of "sinner" came from a 5th grade Sunday school class: "Someone who knows they need God". Most of us claim to be sinners because of moral weakness and poor choices. Or, because of life's challenges that have left us feeling more or less helpless. Once a person knows they're a sinner, they start to

look for God—sometimes they're not even looking, sometimes they are, with as much determination as today's sinful woman.

Human development is primarily a vocation, every person's calling from God 'to be more'.

Therefore, the Church teaches that the essential quality of 'authentic' development is to promote the good of every man (person) and of the whole man (person).

From the teachings of Pope Paul VI, 1967

I've included several quotes today from Pope Paul VI, who served our Church during and right after the Second Vatican Council. During these years as a Church we were "re-discovering" ourselves—who we've always been, but maybe had forgotten. I encourage you to use these quotes as a spiritual exercise this week:

- Slowly read each quote out loud to another person or to yourself.
- Pause for a moment and repeat the quote a second time.
- In silence, think about what you just read or heard for 2-3 minutes. If you are with someone, you may want to share your thoughts with each other.
- End by slowly reading each quote one last time.

When I did this last summer I began to better understand that this is the work of the Church, maybe even the special purpose of our parish. I think we are called to help each other and all others recognize that we are created in God's image and to mature in a love that becomes concern and care for others.

What do you think? I'd love to know what comes of your prayer, reflection, and conversation about these things!

PAST, PRESENT AND FUTURE

THE 3 MOST IMPORTANT THINGS YOU CAN DO TO LOWER YOUR RISK OF DE-VELOPING CANCER

1. KNOW YOUR FAMILY HISTORY:

Learn everything you can about the health histories of all your close relatives and share it with your doctor. Even if you have inherited a risk for a specific cancer, earlier and more frequent screenings, as well as preventive treatments in some cases, may help reduce your chances of developing cancer.

2. MAKE HEALTHY CHOICES TO-DAY—AND EVERY DAY:

Avoid all tobacco products. Eat more fruits and vegetables, whole grains, and less animal fat. Get at least 30 minutes of daily activity to help with weight control. Always use sun screen. Limit alcohol—no more than two drinks per day for men: one for women.

3.FOLLOW CANCER-SCREENING GUIDELINES FOR YOUR AGE, SEX, AND OTHER RISK FACTORS:

Screenings, such as colorectal cancer screenings for all adults beginning at age 50; mammograms for women beginning age 40; PAP tests beginning no later than age 21. Talk with your doctor—people with certain risk factors may need earlier screenings.

FYI—You can find free help on how to collect and organize your family health history at https://familyhistory.hhs.gov.

Like curly hair or freckles, family members can share a combination of factors, including genes, lifestyle, and environment that put them at high risk for certain diseases, including cancer, diabetes, and heart disease. Knowing your family history and sharing it with your doctor can help you understand your risk and take steps to stay healthy.

Tax Credits Available for Gifts Made Prior to June 30!

Room at the Inn has tax credits for gifts made prior to the end of the State of Missouri's fiscal year, June 30. This means your gift equaling \$250 or more to Room at the Inn will allow you to take a credit on your Missouri State income taxes. This is a CREDIT in additional to the deduction you are allowed to take for charitable contributions.

Here's what you need to know:

- * The credit is equal to 50% of the amount of your gift, with a minimum gift of \$250.
