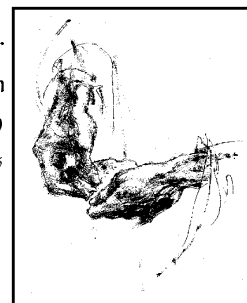

Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding.

Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

I ONCE HAD AN accidental meeting with the Archbishop of Cuernavacca, Mexico. Growing older and a bit frail, he didn't often meet with groups anymore, but he called that day at the last minute to schedule a visit, if we still wanted to come. We did and left

as soon as we could. He was anxious to hear about our visit to his country, our experience of the lives of the poor, and what we thought about the story and struggle of the Church to make a difference. When he spoke he was gentle, humble, and sincere. Clearly the Gospel was the light of his life, his plan for how to live each day. One of us eventually asked him, *"What can we do to help?"* I think he surprised us all when he said, *"Read what the bishops of your country are writing."*

Now I will be the first to admit that Church documents are not often—if ever—easy reading. They refer to scripture a lot. They teach, often one idea building a tradition of ideas going back hundreds and hundreds of years, about war and peace, economy and politics, about life in our Church, our families and communities. Always hard reading it seemed to me for the lack of good stories or pictures.

Ever since that visit though, I've thought a lot about this: If we didn't like what he had say, then why did we ever ask the question in the first place. **Our passion for doing can be born from and guided by thinking and remembering as much seeing.**

So lately I've been reading and sharing with you here a few things from the Pope's recent pastoral letter, *Charity in Truth*. I've been thinking what he has to say might help us to know the **future of our parish**—who we are, why we're here, what God wants us to do.

So once again I invite you to carefully and patiently consider his words and what they might tell you. Let me know.

The "astonishing experience of gift" — "gratuitousness" — often goes "unrecognized because of a purely consumerist and utilitarian view of life. The human being is made for gift, which expresses and makes present his (each person's) transcendent dimension."

Ask Yourself: How was my life a gift—a grace from God—for others this past week? How do I want it to be a gift this week?

"Christian hope, ...a powerful social resource at the service of integral human development,"

Teachers Instructions

Beginning with Breadsticks

- 1 package of refrigerated breadsticks
- 2 Tbsp. sugar
- 1/4 tsp. cinnamon
- 1 Tbsp. butter/margarine

1. Separate breadsticks and form one of them into the letter that your name begins with. Form the other breadsticks into the other letters in your name.
2. Place the breadsticks on a greased baking sheet and bake as directed on package.
3. Meanwhile, mix the sugar and cinnamon in a small bowl. In a separate bowl melt the butter in the microwave.
4. When breadsticks are finished cooking, remove them from the baking sheet and brush them with the melted butter.
5. Sprinkle each with the sugar/cinnamon mixture.
