#### Sacrament of Marriage

#### Anointing of the Sick

If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

HAT DOES IT TAKE
to be totally resolute about
something? Jesus resoluteness comes
from his radical commitment to the
will of the Father, to his mission to
establish "the reign of God", to
bringing salvation. Neither frustration
nor fatigue, disappointment nor
rejection, nor even death, can deter him
from being or acting in accord with
who he is — "Jesus", the Savior.

None of us is as resolute as Jesus. Many things stop us dead in our tracks, make us want to turn back or give up. Even so, Jesus is very patient with our weak resolve and gives us the strength we need—in spite of meandering off the path of life—to continue the journey. This strength comes through the love and support of family and friends and fellow parish members. Gradually we learn from them to let go of less important things and we experience the good that comes from our self-giving. The Good News is that to be totally resolute we need to rely, not on ourselves, but on Jesus, who is with us to the end of our journey and beyond.

As a parish we are and must continue to be a support for each other on this journey of faith—individually and as a community. One powerful way we do this is the devotion of parish members who belong to our Prayer Chain. This important ministry of our parish helps many not to lose their faith, not to give up on the journey of faith, especially when tested by suffering, the challenges of daily life, or by doubts. Prayer helps us all to grow, to become more than we are today. Our practices of Stewardship also reveal our determination for this journey of faith, for the work of making the reign of God more evident in our community. As they realized where they were heading, the disciples never succeeded in talking Jesus off the road to Jerusalem. They were humbled by such great love and faithfully looked for ways to imitate that love in their lives.

Spiritual Exercise: Think of the 10 chapter long journey of Jesus and his disciples to Jerusalem as a "field education" exercise in living by faith. Listen to the Gospels of the coming weeks with these questions in mind:



# DO YOU KNOW WHAT **GOUT** IS? KEY FACTS ABOUT GOUT

**Q:** What is *gout* and who gets it?

A: Gout is a chronic condition and is the most common form of inflammatory arthritis in men, affecting approximately 5 million Americans. Women can also suffer from gout and are most often affected after menopause. Gout occurs when excess uric acid in the body begins to form crystals in the joints, and attacks are often characterized by intense pain, redness, swelling and heat in the affected joint. Gout can affect several different body parts, including elbows, knees and wrists; however, patients most commonly experience attacks in the big toe.

**Q:** Do diet and lifestyle cause *gout*?

**A:** The commonly held belief that diet and lifestyle alone cause gout is actually inaccurate. Diet is one of many things that can trigger gout attacks if you already have a high uric acid level. Uric acid is an end-product created when the body metabolizes substances called purines. Purines are produced by the body and also found in many foods, such as seafood, red meat and alcohol. Some people produce too much uric acid or have trouble eliminating what they produce. When this happens, uric acid levels may become too high and can lead to gout. If you have gout, eliminating highpurine foods from your diet may help lower your uric level. However, in most cases, just changing diet alone may not be enough to control the underlying cause, high uric acid. A genetic link to high uric acid has also been identified.

**Q:** How is gout managed?

A: Decreasing uric acid to the recommended target level is the goal for managing gout over the long term. Healthcare providers may prescribe medications or recommend over-the-counter treatments to address the pain and inflammation of gout attacks, but it's important to remember that treating pain and inflammation doesn't address the underlying cause of gout, high uric acid. Managing uric acid levels may help reduce the risk of future gout attacks. It is important to work with a health care provider to help determine the best management plan.


