Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.



THE SCIENCE OF AGIGN

- Good news—more and more conferences on aging are including topics on spirituality, and in American medical schools, medical students are taking courses that deal with spirituality. (watch the bulletin for more of these opportunities.)
- "Listen to your Feet" you may have a broken toe or arthritis, but there is a possibility that your aching feet indicate a problem elsewhere in your body. See your podiatrist for more information.





The story of Martha and Mary reminds us that God wants each of us to serve Him, just as Martha so graciously served. However, we will never know what God wants us to do unless we spend some time like Mary did, just sitting quietly at God's feet and listening to His words.

The St. Vincent de Paul Society is in great need of canned food for our two food pantries and funds for utility assistance.

The requests for assistance have always been greater in the months of July through December. However, the current economic conditions have magnified the need. Many people have lost jobs or had their hours cut. Their income doesn't pay the bills for utilities, food and shelter. We are seeing many single and two-parent families who have never had to ask for assistance.

Your generosity makes our ministry possible and we try very hard to be good stewards of the funds you provide. Last year, we spent \$66,074.00 for 680 families for utility assistance. We have used all of the funds from several generous bequests since 2005 and are operating on the funds we receive from the blue envelopes and memorials.

Last year our food pantries served 2,111 families. We have received the last distribution of canned food from the Mail Carrier Drive this month. The next major canned food collection is the Boy Scout Drive on Thanksgiving weekend. Your donations of canned food can be put in the brown containers at the church entrances or dropped off at the parish office

We know there are many demands on your resources and we truly appreciate the sacrifices you make to help others in need.
