Anointing of the Sick

If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. 





BE PREPARED!!!!

You are probably asking yourself...."Be prepared for what?" Be prepared for donating blood! That's what! When we are prepared for an event, or a big game or an exam or test, don't they go smooth and without any problems. Well, the same stands for when we donate blood. And this is the best time to prepare because Holy Name of Jesus is sponsoring a blood drive this Tuesday, July 27, 2010 in the community center from 3pm—7pm. And aside from making sure you have proper ID, I'm going to share some other ideas of being prepared to donate blood.

Nutrition and iron are important in everyone's life, especially to a blood donor. At the blood drive, your blood will be checked to determine if your Red Blood Cells are adequate for donation. Iron combines with protein in our blood to produce hemoglobin, the substance that carries oxygen from our lungs to the rest of the cells in our body. We should always have a diet rich in iron, but when we are going to donate blood, we can increase those requirements to guarantee that the Red Cross will accept our blood. Not passing the test, does not mean you are unhealthy, it just means your iron level is to low to donate.

To increase your chances of donating blood, **eat a diet rich in iron** a few days prior to donating blood. Foods rich in iron are; red meat, oysters, clams, soybeans, dried beans, peas, and lentils, whole grain cereals and breads, as well as prunes and dried fruits.

Vitamin C helps the body absorb iron, so add vitamin C to your diet when you are increasing your iron intake. Vitamin C is found in citrus fruits and juices, kiwi, cantaloupe, strawberries, broccoli, tomatoes, peppers, potatoes, cabbage, spinach and leafy greens.

One last thing to do to help your iron level stay adequate is to **drink water**, and lots of it. Tannins in tea and coffee block the absorption of iron in our blood, so stay away from them when you are trying to increase your iron



Jesus assures us that if we ask Him, God will take care of what we need. The problem is that in our culture we often confuse what we really **need** with what we simply **want**. We <u>need</u> very little. However, we usually <u>want</u> so much more. A good steward only asks God for what he needs.

The St. Vincent de Paul Society is in great need of canned food for our two food pantries and funds for utility assistance.

The requests for assistance have always been greater in the months of July through December. However, the current economic conditions have magnified the need. Many people have lost jobs or had their hours cut. Their income doesn't pay the bills for utilities, food and shelter. We are seeing many single and two-parent families who have never had to ask for assistance.

Your generosity makes our ministry possible and we try very hard to be good stewards of the funds you provide. Last year, we spent \$66,074.00 for 680 families for utility assistance. We have used all of the funds from several generous bequests since 2005 and are operating on the funds we receive from the blue envelopes and memorials.

Last year our food pantries served 2,111 families. We have received the last distribution of canned food from the Mail Carrier Drive this month. The next major canned food collection is the Boy Scout Drive on Thanksgiving weekend. Your donations of canned food can be put in the brown containers at the church entrances or dropped off at the parish office.

We know there are many demands on your resources and we truly appreciate the sacrifices you make to help others in need.
