UNDERSTANDING THE BASICS OF GALLSTONES

Gallstones are crystal-like deposits that develop in the gallbladder-a small, pear-shaped organ that stores bile, a digestive juice produced by the liver. These deposits may be as small as a grain of sand or as large as a golf ball; they may be hard or soft, smooth or jagged. There may be one or several gallstones.

Nearly 10% of men and 20% of women in the U.S. have gallstones or will develop them at some time in life, yet most of those who have the condition do not realize it.

When symptoms do occur, it's usually because the gallstone has moved and become lodged within a duct that carries bile. The typical symptom is abdominal pain, accompanied by nausea, indigestion, or fever. The pain generally occurs within an hour of eating a large meal or in the middle of the night.

Gallstones are also more common in people over the age of 60, in those who are obese or have lost a lot of weight in a short amount of time, in those who have diabetes, and in women who have had multiple pregnancies and who take hormone replacement therapy.

WHAT CAUSES THEM

The primary function of the gallbladder is to store bile that helps the body break down fatty food. When a meal is eaten, the gallbladder releases its stored bile.

Gallstones can form even in people who eat properly. A diet extremely low or high in fat can contribute to gallstone formation. Other factors that can reduce activity in the gallbladder, possibly leading to gallstone formation, include cirrhosis, the use of hormone replacement therapy, and pregnancy.

Family history, diabetes, sudden weight loss, and cholesterol drugs, and older age can also increase risk for gallstones.

And so, pay attention to any severe abdominal pain that may arise. Take it seriously and check with your doctor.


