

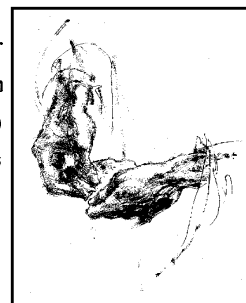

Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding.

Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

T **HE MOST RECENT STUDY ON VOCATIONS** in the United States found that 30-40% of young men have **thought about** the possibility of the priesthood. The survey also found one important reason why most do not explore the possibility any further than their private thoughts—**no one ever asked**, no one ever **encouraged**, no one **offered support**.

Each of us must invite and challenge the elementary and high school students we know as well as young adult Catholics to explore a vocation to the priesthood, diaconate, or religious life, if we think they may be **gifted for such a calling** and especially if we know they've been **thinking about it**. 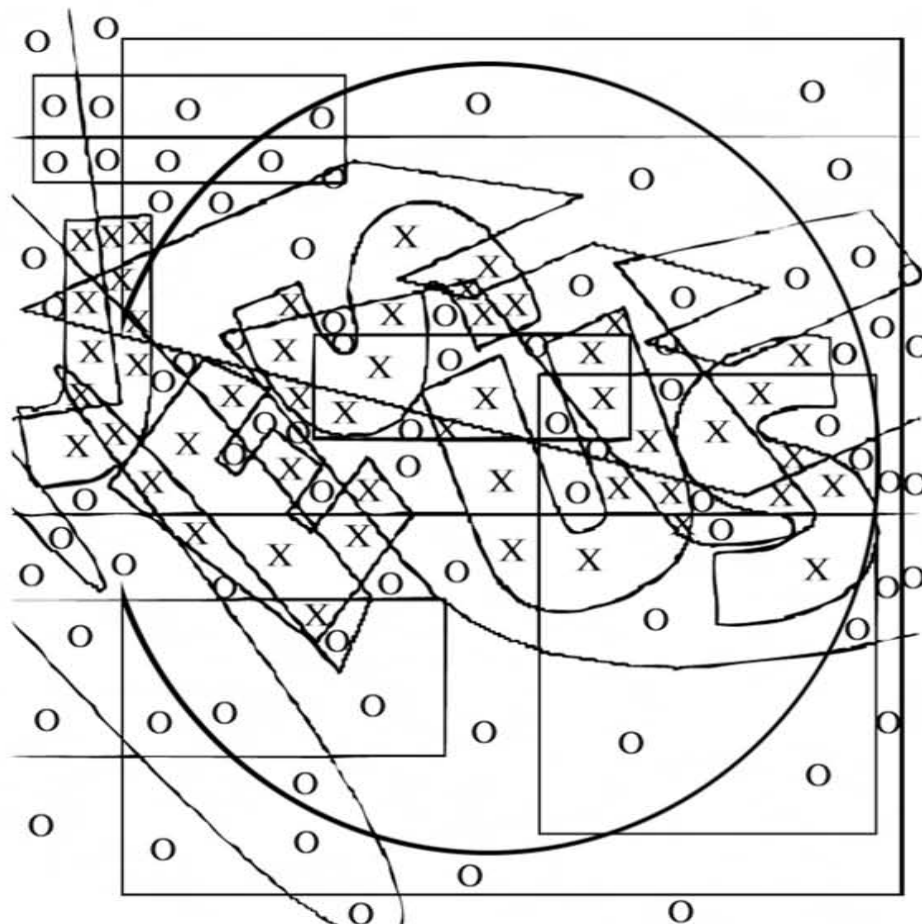
