Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

These gatherings have also been an important opportunity for priests to get to know each other better and to renew our common commitment of service to the people of the Archdiocese and the mission of the Church of St. Louis.



VDT1 What is it and do you suffer from it?

All of these gadgets have Video Display Terminals (VDT). Many adults and children who use VDT's at home or at work may notice eyestrain. Other signs and symptoms include:

- Eye discomfort or irritation.
- Eye fatigue
- Having a hard time focusing
- Back pain, shoulder pain and headaches.
- Improper position of leading to posture.

WHAT TO DO?

- Dust off the screen
- Position the VDT screen about 2 feet from eyes.
- Reduce glare.
- Place paperwork close enough that you don't have to keep refocusing when switching from the screen to the paper.
- Blink often to keep your yes from getting dry.
- Keep screen free from blurs or flickers
