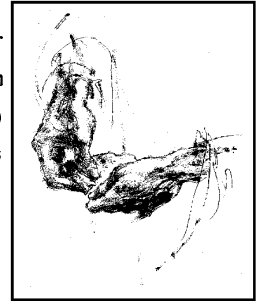

Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

SETTING LIMITS ON SCREEN TIME

The average adult in the U.S. watches almost five hours of television per day. Even for people with high levels of physical activity, watching four or more hours of TV and screen-based entertainment per day is associated with worse mental health, obesity, diabetes, high blood pressure, low levels of “good” (HDL) cholesterol, and a 46% greater risk of early death. What can you do to protect yourself and your family from an overdose of this technology.

1. Take TV’s and computers out of the bedroom (this may both reduce your screen time and improve your sleep time).

2. Avoid TV or other screen-based entertainment during mealtime (you may find you eat less and talk more).

3. Turn the TV off when no one is watching (to save power and your health).

4. Set a daily limit on your TV and screen-based entertainment time and track it. One study found that people assigned a lock-out device triggered at one half a person’s usual TV time burned more than 200 additional calories per day than people not given the device.

These simple changes may help control your weight, improve your physical and mental health, and give you more time for the people and activities you love.

St. Vincent de Paul Society is in great need of canned food for our two food pantries and funds for utility assistance.

The requests for assistance have always been greater in the months of July through December. However, the current economic conditions have magnified the need. Many people have lost jobs or had their hours cut. Their income doesn't pay the bills for utilities, food and shelter. We are seeing many single and two-parent families who have never had to ask for assistance.

Your generosity makes our ministry possible and we try very hard to be good stewards of the funds you provide. Last year, we spent \$66,074.00 for 680 families for utility assistance. We have used all of the funds from several generous bequests since 2005 and are operating on the funds we receive from the blue envelopes and memorials.

Last year our food pantries served 2,111 families. We have received the last distribution of canned food from the Mail Carrier Drive. The next major canned collection is the Boy Scout Drive on Thanksgiving weekend. Your donations of canned food can be put in the brown containers at the church entrances or dropped off at the parish office.

We know there are many demands on your resources and we truly appreciate the sacrifices you make to help others in need. Thank you and God bless you
