Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.






Teachers Instructions



For Daughters of Today and Tomorrow

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month. I know all of you know what cancer is, and that it is life changing when someone receives a diagnosis of cancer. Most of you, if not all of you have heard of breast cancer. I will not get into all the many kinds of breast cancer or the many stages of cancer when someone is diagnosed with a more invasive cancer than just a benign tumor.

Excluding cancers of the skin, breast cancer is the most common cancer among women, accounting for nearly 1 in 4 cancers diagnosed in US women. Men have a low risk of developing breast cancer, but changes should be reported to their doctor.

Breast cancer incidence and death rates generally increase with age. During the period of 2002-2006, 95% new cases and 97% of breast cancer deaths occurred in women aged 40 and older. The lowest incidence occurred in women 20-24 with the highest incidence occurring in women aged 75-79. During this same period of time, the median age at diagnosis was 61, meaning that 50% of the women diagnosed was age 61 or younger.

These women are our daughters and mothers, they are also granddaughters.

Research and education are 2 things that will help raise awareness of breast cancer, as well as other cancers.

American Cancer Society is holding an event called "Making Strides Against Breast Cancer" on October 30th. It will be held in our beautiful "Forest Park" and it is a 5K/3.1 mile walk. Sister Rose and I would like to get a team together from HNJ. Our team is not for anyone in particular, but for all the women in our lives who have been touched by breast cancer or will possibly be touched by breast cancer in the future. I am walking for my daughters, and nieces, and sisters, and all the women in my life.

If you would be interested in joining our team, please contact me through the parish office. You can join to walk with us, you can make a donation or you can pray for all with breast cancer. October is also one of the months we celebrate our Blessed Mother. I pray to her through the intercession of Our Lord, Jesus Christ for a successful team.


