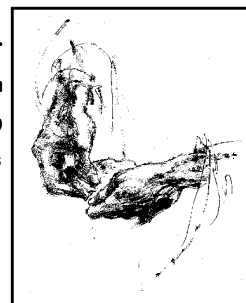

Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

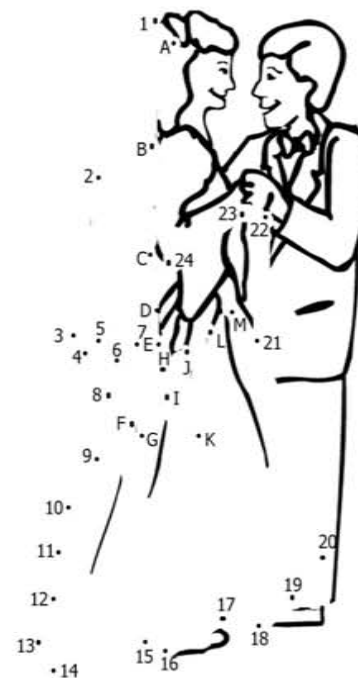

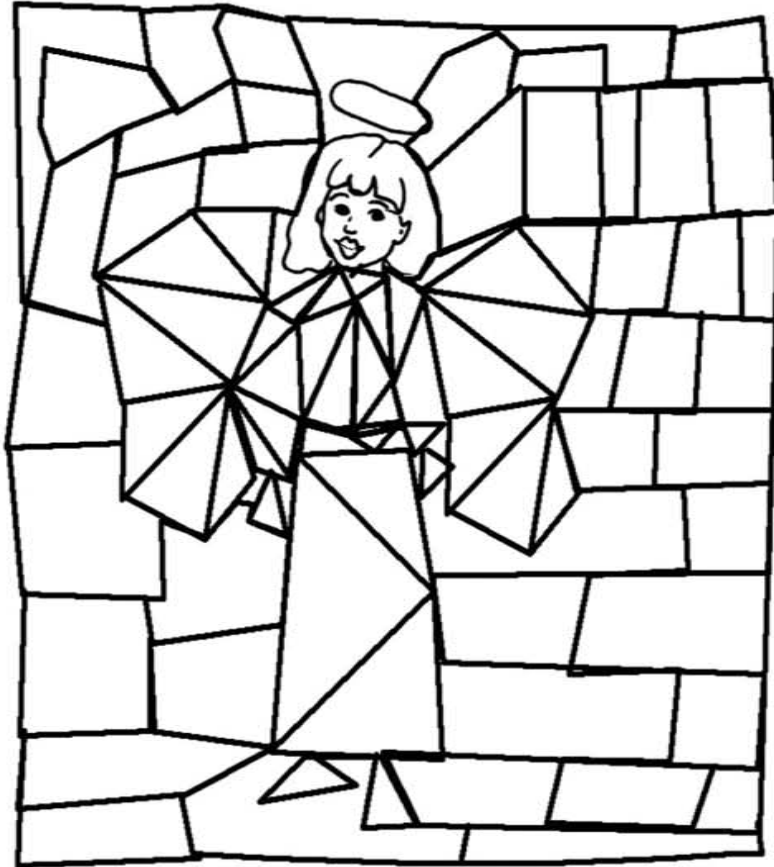

KEEPING OUR CHILDREN SAFE.

Did you know that according to the FBI's National Crime Information Center, more than 719,500 missing person records were reported in 2009 and 90% of those were children. Take the steps to protect your children by following some simple guidelines.

- Parents and children need to have a simple code word for emergencies.
- Make sure your child knows how to contact you at all your phone numbers.
- Know where your children are and who they are with.
- NEVER leave your child alone in a public place, stroller or car.
- Always accompany your child to a public restroom.
- Teach your children how to call 911.
- Have a plan in case your child gets separated from you in a public place.
- Teach your children to always get permission before getting a ride or going anywhere with someone else.
- Teach your children to make sure they stay in groups of friends when going somewhere.
- Know the name, address, phone number and parents name when children are away with a friend.
- Tell your children about child abduction in simple terms.

While these steps can help protect your children, it is important to know that one four letter emotion can render all of your efforts useless, FEAR. How can we combat something so deeply ingrained in each of us? You need to drill into your children that NOISE is their best defense in the face of abduction. Regardless of the threat that is being made at them or their loved ones, they MUST raise a commotion to put fear of capture into the bad persons head. Let's work together to keep our children safe at all times.

We Believe the Every Human Person is Created in the Imagine and Likeness of God
Called to Holiness—Called to Sainthood

Every year during the month of November we celebrate the saints—those men and women we have come to know, some quite personally, who reveal God to us and inspire us to greatness. Whether our contemporaries or of ages past saints enable us to experience communion with God and to encounter Christ.

Our Catholic **tradition of venerating relics** recalls the customary practice of early Christians gathering for the Eucharist at the tombs of martyrs. As Jesus offered himself on the cross, so the martyrs shed their blood for the growth of the Church. We aspire to likewise offer ourselves completely to Christ. The custom of venerating authentic relics may seem strange, but is quite similar to the respect shown for a lock of hair or death mask from a deceased president, composer, or other public figure.

The one who sat on the throne showed me **the holy city, Jerusalem** ...

*“The wall of the city had **twelve courses of stones** as its foundation, on which were written the names of the **twelve apostles of the Lamb.**”*

St. John the Evangelist, The Book of Revelation 21:14

Every year the **Feast of All Saints** (November 1st) honors the men and women whose example we admire and invites us into the mystery of death and the promise of eternal life. First celebrated in Rome in 609AD, this feast marks the transfer of the relics of the martyrs of Rome to The Pantheon. This place for worship of all the pagan gods was rededicated by Pope Benedict IV in honor of Mary and all the Christian saints—and in turn the one Christian God. Since Vatican II, the number of men and women canonized as saints has increased considerably. Although we do not celebrate all their names on specific dates in all our churches throughout the year, we do gather them as one on this day.

In the northern hemisphere as the days grow shorter our Church also celebrates the **Feast of All Souls** (November 2nd) — a somber feast fitting the temperament of darkening days, our bodies and minds resigning themselves to the inevitable coming of death. On this day we turn our thoughts to the souls who await the fullness of God’s glory. The sequence of these two feasts implies a belief that those who have lived lives of holiness enjoy God’s presence and can intercede for us before the throne of God. Others, having lived more sinful lives, still await that glory. These are the dead we remember on this feast and for whom we pray that God’s mercy will bring them to the vision of blessedness for which they longed. Those who assisted us in life receive assistance from us in their death. This feast celebrates our union with the Church in every place and beyond all time.
