

#### Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

#### Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.


#### **Teachers Instructions**



#### HOW IS YOUR BONE HEALTH?

Did you know there are things you can do to help with your bone density and osteoporosis? You simply must make some dietary changes that will benefit your bone health. A bone healthy diet is a matter of eating more fruits and vegetables and getting enough calcium and vitamin D..

 Calcium is the key to maintaining healthy bones. It is best to get calcium from foods we eat but supplements may help Adults should aim for 1000 mg of calcium per day. However, after age 50 we need 1200 mg. However, never take more than 2500 mg as it blocks other important nutrients. Food sources for calcium include:

Dairy products.

Canned sardines

Fortified juices

Dark, green leafy vegetables.

Vitamin D helps the body use the calcium taken in. The
best source of vitamin D is sunlightó 15 minutes a day.
However, Vitamin D can also be gotten from supplements. At least 400-800 IU are needed a day. There are
few foods with Vitamin D though some cereals and
foods are fortified with it.

Eat fresh, colorful produce.

Moderate alcohol consumption. It interferes with absorption of calcium.

Cut out caffeine and carbonated drinks. They have a negative effect on bone health.

Cut back on salt. Eating salty foods causes the body to lose calcium

By making a few simple changes to diets, healthier bones can be had.

#### **Federation Leadership**

Our Federation of Schools is constituted around an agreement that names the 11 pastors and 8 elementary school principals as leaders of the Federation. This group is meeting 4 times a year and now serves as the primary policy making group for the Federation. In addition, the principals are meeting about once a month on the development and implementation of programs designed to enhance the education of our children, to enrich extracurricular activities, and to foster faculty development.

#### Federation Teachers "Take It Up a Notch"

There is little doubt that the teachers in our Catholic schools are dedicated and talented professionals educators. The challenge, however, for small schools ó often ented professionals educators. The challenge, however, for small schools ó often with just one class per grade ó is that these teachers have little opportunity to grow professionally with colleagues that teach their grade or their subject specialties. The Federation wants to change that.

For the past several months, teachers in all grades at all eight Federation schools have been meeting regularly to exchange ideas, share teaching strategies, and research new methodologies.

oThe teachers in our schools have often had to teach in isolation trying to be everything to every child in their class, ö explains Jennifer Stutsman, principal of Blessed Teresa of Calcutta. õThrough these Professional Learning Teams, our teachers are learning from each other, challenging the status quo, and seeking new methods to help each child learn.ö

Throughout the school year, the teams will meet during professional development days and in their free time. A coordinator is responsible for each group, with groups divided by grade or subject area. Even teachers in special subject areas such as art, music, and P.E. have created professional learning teams.

In their early meetings, teams were asked to identify several goals for the year. Some examples include:

- Third grade teachers will be working with students on their writing skills by establishing pen pals across the eight schools, culminating in a joint field trip.
- The librarians at each school are creating a resource guide to share with each other about where to buy books, what each school has, and what books are popular with the students now.
- The upper grade literature teachers will be focusing on student comprehension by studying and applying the theory of Multiple Intelligences.

Parish funds in support of the Federation have been allocated to provide for purchasing research materials, to hire substitutes if the teachers want to observe each other, and to purchase supplies for a collaborative learning project.
