#### Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

#### Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

## Let's Walk Together Again

**PERSON CLIMBING A MOUNTAIN** must pay attention to many details and difficulties along thee route. Often the climb is tedious and strenuous. At the summit, however, a vista so overpowering and awesome opens up that the struggles of the climb recede into oblivion.

Our journey of discipleship as we **prepare for the final coming of Christ** is **similar to climbing a mountain**. The work is hard and long. Our vision tends to be focused on immediate concerns. **Jesus challenges us to wake up now to a broader vision:** to put off sinful conduct and to look beyond immediate concerns to is final coming.

"In the days to come, **the mountain** of the Lord's house **shall be established** as the highest mountain and raised above the hills.

All nations shall stream toward it.

O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the Lord."

The Book of the Prophet Isaiah 2: 2,5

The **key to a broader vision** is to **keep our eyes on Christ** as the center of our lives by—

- Seeing a plea for help in the eyes of a neighbor in need and taking the time to respond
- Being patient when someone is annoying or frustrating us.

Preparing for **the coming of Christ** means that we recognize Christ in ourselves as well as in those around us every day and respond as Jesus would. **Isaiah's insight**—a revelation from God to us—is that not only is the mountain hard to climb, but more importantly, **we are the mountain**. When we walk in the light of the Lord, when we're reconciled with God, when we are known for our unconditional love for each other, even strangers and enemies, **the nations will stream toward us**. People want, hunger for, what we have to give.

About a year ago I asked everyone to **consider promising** that they would receive and celebrate the **Sacrament of Reconciliation** one more time than usual during the coming year. We are now nearing the end of that year. This Sacrament is an opportunity for each of us to **stand in the light of the Lord** so that we can all the more confidently **walk in the light of the Lord**. It's a Sacrament that can you have **a clear and wonderful vision** of yourself, all others, and the world in which we now live. It's a Sacrament that can help you see how you are a minister of reconciliation to others and in many kinds of difficult situations.

I encourage every member of our parish to make plans now to participate in our Advent Penance Service — to celebrate God's reconciling love by confessing your sin (your need for God) and your faith (your thanks for God's grace in your life). Our service will be held this year <u>AT</u> Our Lady of the Rosary Parish on Tuesday, December 7th at 7:00pm. On that night our two parish communities will also welcoming our 2nd grade children to the celebration of this Sacrament for the first time. Your presence will be an encouragement for them to always value and use this Sacrament as a special means of staying close to Christ and strong in Christ's love for others. Their presence will inspire us all to remember the value of this Sacrament and its place in our lives.



What are the AHA's "Life's Simple 7"? They are:

- DON'T SMOKE
- MAINTAIN A NORMAL BMI
- EXERCISE REGULARLY
- EAT A HEALTHY DIET
- KEEP YOUR CHOLESTEROL LOW
- MAINTAIN NORMAL BLOOD PRES-SURE
- KEEP YOUR BLOOD SUGAR LOW

If people already follow these 7 simple rules, they are already heart healthy. If even one of these is not in "check", everything else will potentially become affected and put people at risk for heart disease.

Research reported by the AHA shows that few Americans make simple changes that could prevent most cases of heart disease. In fact, one study of almost 18,000 people found that only .01 percent followed all seven health factors, these health factors are essential in living long healthy lives. For each health factor we keep at a balance, we decrease our risk of developing heart disease. The more factors we keep in balance, the greater percentage we have of being heart healthy.
