

Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

Teachers Instructions

Go Fish!

You will need a deck of cards and at least one other player.

- 1. Give each player 5 cards face down. Put the rest of the cards face down on the table and smear them around.
- 2. Players look at their cards as they hold them.
- Player #1 asks Player #2 if s/he has any ___ (name of a card that Player #1 already has).
- If Player #2 has any cards that were asked for, s/he must give them to Player #1. It remains Player #1's turn to ask again for a different card.
- If Player #2 does not have the card asked for then Player #1 must "Go Fish" from the pile in the middle and it becomes Player #2's turn to ask.
- The object of the game is to get a set of all four of the same card. Example: Collect all four kings or 8's. The player with the most sets wins the game.
- 7. When a player collects all four of the same card, s/he may place that set down on the table. Then go to the pile and take as many cards as needed to keep 5 cards at all times. If a player has more than 5 cards s/he does not take any cards out of the middle.
- 8. Keep up the game until all cards are out of the middle and placed on the table in sets.





How many of you were able to read the editorial in the "St. Louis Review" last week about dealing with issues of violence and mental illness as Christians. If you hadn't read it, and the paper is on it's way to be recycled, here is a recap.

When tragedy hits a family or a community or even a nation, many of us pause and consider if we are living properly. Are we living according to Gods will, or are we merely going through the motions and living the way our secular society expects us to.

After the first 2-3 days of reporting cleared after the recent Tucson, AR. shootings, the facts began to surface about the alleged gunman's mental instability. The heated debates that will come about from this incident may go on for many years. But, will these debates result in charity toward humans, especially those suffering from some incomprehensible force that causes them to inflict such violence.

Many people who are inflicted with mental illness are not violent and pose very little threat to themselves or others. For most people with mental illness, the issues are more subtle, such as hidden in embarrassment or even ignored by ignorance. Those with mental illness are not deranged lunatics who should be separated from the rest of society. They are human beings with genuine need for help, both medical and spiritual. They are God's children. They are our brothers or sisters, or mothers or fathers, or spouses or friends.

To help all those affected by this recent tragedy, and all those tragedies that will follow, we must recognize the need to take mental illness seriously. We can no longer dismiss warning signs and unusual behavior. There is no simple solution to addressing all the complex issues of mental illness. But, acting on our good Christian values is a great place to start. A deacon, who is also a therapist and author.



Seniors—you may be eligible for a refund of a portion of your real estate taxes or rent if you meet the following qualifications:

- Either age 65 or 100% disabled and between 18-64 or widowed person between 60-64 receiving Social Security surviving spouse benefits.
- As a homeowner, your TOTAL household income was below \$30,000 for a single person or \$34,000 for a married couple.
- As a renter, your TOTAL household income was less than \$27,500 for a single person or \$29,500 for a married couple.
- You lived in Missouri for the entire year.
- You paid real estate taxes or rent on your main homestead.
- You DO NOT rent from a non-profit organization.

You may be eligible for as much as \$1100 in refunds as a homeowner and \$750 in refunds as a renter, depending on what you paid in 2010 and your income.



2010 ANNUAL CONTRIBUTION STATMENTS

As we announced in December a technician of the company we use for computer services erased the hard-drive of our secretary's computer. The record of Sunday contribution from parishioners was part of the information lost by this mistake. We also discovered that our back-up system was not recording information and we were not successful in recovering this data. Every possible effort was made to rebuild our records.

Our defective hardware has been replaced and proper back-up procedures reestablished. We have also been advised to provide you with the following information concerning the proper documentation you may need for filing your annual income tax return.

To claim donations to our parish as charitable deductions –

Upon request we will be able to provide you with a record of your contributions for the period of October 31st, 2010 through December 31, 2010. We will resume providing full contribution statements again in 2011.

Prior to October 31st your cancelled checks for Sunday contributions, Holy Days, or special collections will serve as your record. Regrettably prior to this date we will not be able to substantiate your cash contributions made using your parish envelopes.

Finally, we will substantiate with an acknowledgement letter every single contribution of \$250 or more when you provide us with a copy of your cancelled check(s).
