

Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

IVING HAND TO MOUTH the poor do not often have the luxury of planning ahead. Totally absorbed in the challenge of living, **survival** is the one and only thing occupying their attention. In today's Gospel Jesus may appear to be insensitive to their needs. However, he's actually proposing **an imaginative spiritual exercise** that many of them would have found both interesting and most helpful.

In their 1st century Mediterranean world "happiness"—including survival—had everything to do with "attachment". Everything was practical and down to Earth. "Love" means attachment. "Hate" means dis-attachment or separation. Using images of birds and flowers Jesus invites us all to remember and recommit ourselves to love of neighbor (attachment to each other) and love of God (attachment to God—focusing on God, trusting God, being deeply concerned with serving God single-mindedly).

If you—or we as a parish—want to know what rules our lives (attachments we have), we need only examine how we spend our time and money.

Jesus pushes us beyond everyday worries to reflect on the priorities that lead to ultimate happiness and security—fullness of life in the reign of God. We are and will be happiest—whether poor or rich—when we give ourselves over to God's care for us and share that same care with others.

Father, form us in the likeness of Jesus your Son and deepen His life within us.

Send us as witnesses of Gospel joy

into a world of fragile peace and broken promises. Touch the hearts of all with your love that they may love one another.

Cheese Muffins

134 cups all-purpose flour

1/2 cup sugar

2 tsp baking powder

½ cup chedder cheese

1 beaten egg

3/4 cup milk

1/4 cup cooking oil

Directions:

- 1. Mix the first 4 ingredients.
- Combine egg, milk, and oil and add this to the flour mixture.
- 3. Lightly grease muffin tins and scoop 1 tablespoon full of muffin mix into the bottom of the tins.
- 4. Add 1 teaspoon full of cheese and then 1 more tablespoon of muffin mix.
- 5. Bake at 400° for 20 minutes.







FACTS

Since 1980 the generation of trash has grown by 60%. In the year 2005, we discarded nearly 246 million tons of trash of which 35% is paper and cardboard. The good news is that in 1980 only 10% of the population recycled while in 2005 it was up to 32% and rising. About 84% of all household waste can be recycled. Here are some facts on recycling:

- The average person makes 4.5 pounds of trash a day.
- More than 1 billion trees are used to make disposable diapers every year
- Every ton of paper that is recycled saves 17 trees.
- Burying 15,000 tons of trash creates one job while recycling the same trash would create 9 jobs.
- It takes 40% less energy to recycle aluminum cans then it takes to make new ones.
- Enough energy is saved by recycling one aluminum can to run a TV set for 3 hours.
- If every American household recycled just one out of every ten plastic bottles they use it would keep 200 million pounds of plastic out of the landfills every year.
