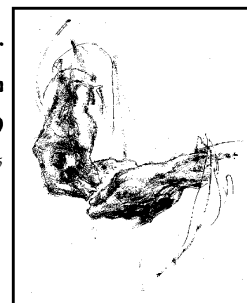

## Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a **wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed.** Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

## Anointing of the Sick

**The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.**

**Welcome the Passover—**

**The Three Days of Easter**

On Holy Thursday, Lent comes to an end and the three days (Triduum) of the death, rest and resurrection of the Lord begins. This is our Passover, our Easter.

Plan ahead to make these days special. From Holy Thursday evening through the Vigil of Easter, we try not to cook or work or go to school or play games or run errands. Instead we fast, pray and keep watch. Then, the breakfast of Easter Sunday morning “breaks” our “fast”.

During these days, our parish is at its best. Try to be at church on Holy Thursday, Good Friday and especially, for the Easter Vigil, the most wonderful night of the Year.

**Holy Thursday—April 21, 2011**

During the day we prepare to enter our Paschal Fast. We clean the house for Easter. For dinner, we eat greens to welcome the Passover.

At the liturgy we focus on service. This is symbolized through the washing of feet and the celebration of the Eucharist. We invite you to bring a bell so that we can make a joyful sound during the Gloria.

Traditionally a collection is taken up to assist the poor and needy. Our Holy Thursday collection will be for our St. Vincent de Paul to assist their ministry to those in need in our community.

The Liturgy will conclude with a Eucharistic Procession and time of Adoration. Plan on spending some time in prayer keeping watch with the Lord.

**Good Friday—April 22, 2011**

On Good Friday we continue our Paschal Fast and abstain from meat. Try to keep this day as a day of quiet and reflection.

Refrain from regular TV viewing or radio listening. Plan to watch a religious movie as a family. Set up a cross in a special place in the home for prayer.

In the afternoon, walk with Jesus as we celebrate the Stations of the Cross.

In the evening, join the parish community as we celebrate the Passion of the Lord. Our collection will be for the upkeep and the sites in the Holy Land and those who care for them.

**Holy Saturday—April 23, 2011**

This is a quiet day, a day of rest and remembrance of Christ resting in the tomb. Rest during the day to get ready for the holy night ahead. Decorate for Easter, color eggs, gather flowers.

Gather the food for your Easter Meal and bring it to church at noon for the Blessing of Easter Food.

In the evening, celebrate the Easter Vigil with the community, a night in which we recall the resurrection of Christ and our participation in that new life.

At the liturgy, we will renew our Baptism so wear something white to symbolize your baptismal garment. Bring a jar or container to take some of the newly blessed Easter water home and placed in your prayer space or on your dining room table.

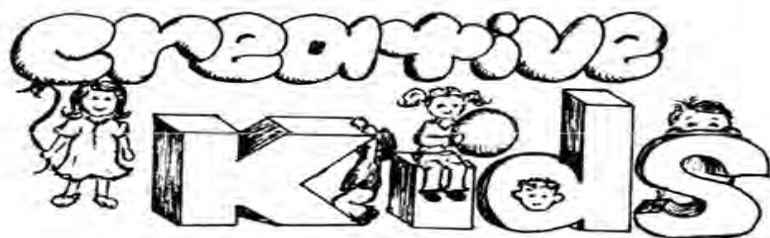

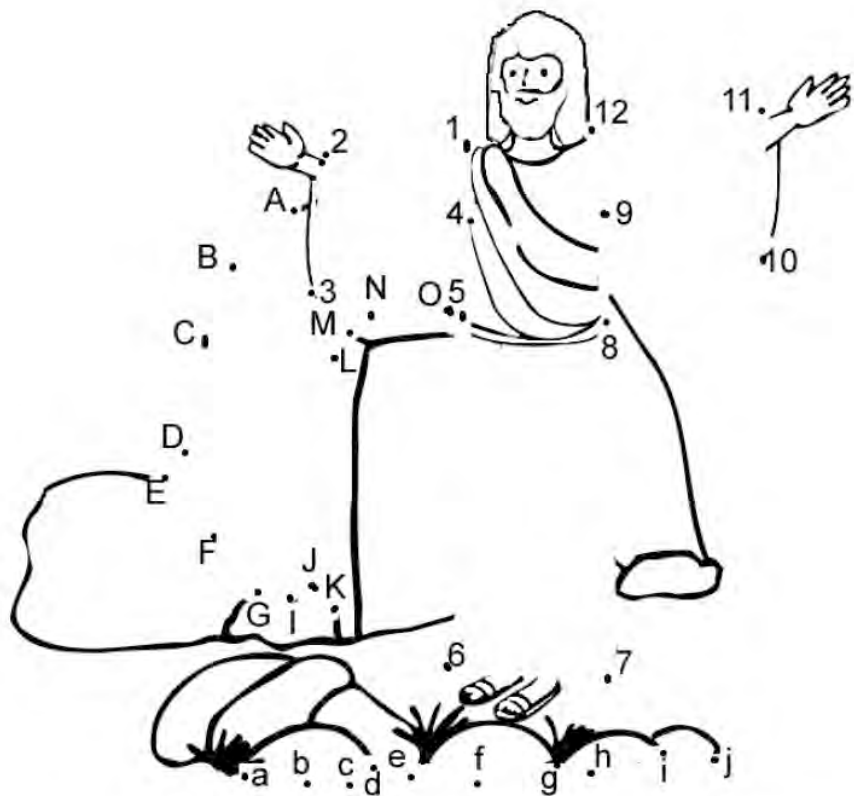

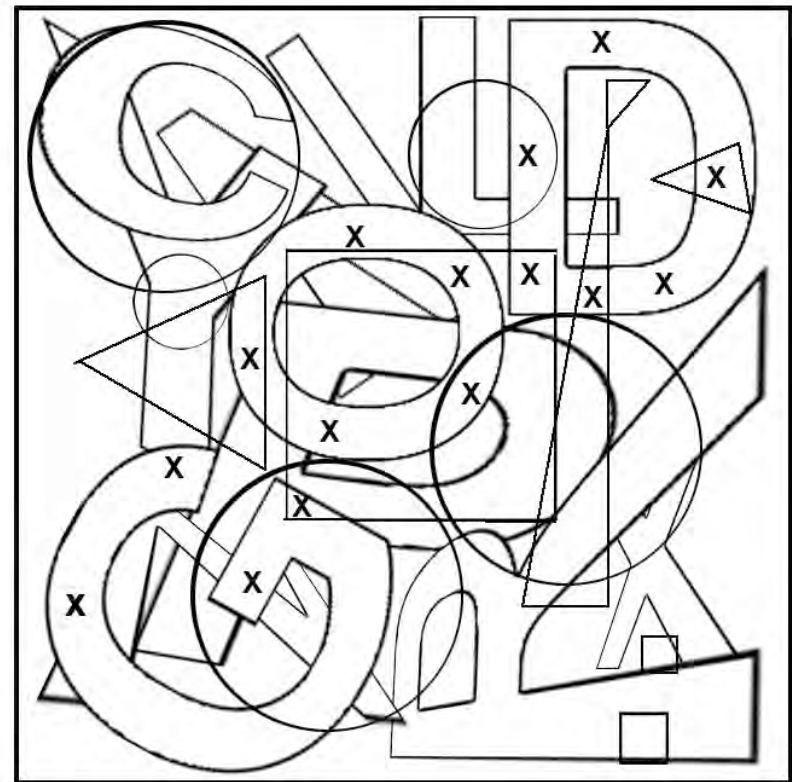

## IT'S THAT SINUS TIME OF THE YEAR.

Many of us experience sinus problems with the change of seasons. The sinuses are behind the cheekbones and forehead and around the eyes.

Sinus problems include:

- A sinus infection which can be acute or chronic
- Sinus congestion with or without an infection

Signs and symptoms for a sinus infection are:

- Fever
- Green, yellow or bloody nasal drainage
- Foul smelling or tasting postnasal drip
- Severe headache that doesn't get better when you take over-the-counter pain medication
- Pain between the nose and lower eyelids
- A feeling of pressure inside the head or a stuffy nose
- Swelling around the eyes or nose, cheeks and forehead
- Cough that worsens at night
- Fatigue

Treatment:

Sinus congestion without an infection can be treated with self-care measures such as a decongestant. An acute sinus infection usually clears up in 2 weeks. It requires antibiotics, a decongestant and a spray.

**SELF-CARE:**

Place a warm washcloth over the sinus areas  
Drink plenty of liquids to thin secretions

**5th Sunday of Lent**

*"So they took away the stone," JOHN 11:41*

Perhaps one of Our Lord's greatest miracles was the raising of Lazarus. Yet, we see that even in this great miracle Jesus calls others to act. He tells the crowd to roll away the stone from the tomb. And they protest, saying it will stink. How often do we think that something God is asking us to do might "stink" - whether it is giving more of our time, our talent or our treasure? Yet if we are willing to follow Our Lord's command and take away the stones that block us from participating in God's work, we can expect great miracles in our lives.
