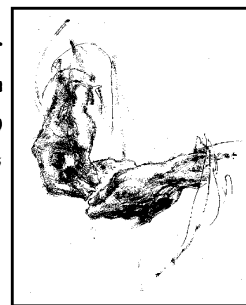

Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a **wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed.** Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

As a part of our archdiocesan **Annual Catholic Appeal** next weekend we will welcome to our

parish **Ms. Peggy O'Brien**, the Principal of Our Lady of Guadalupe School, together with faculty members, **Kathy Long, Anne Cook, and Jessie Joiner**. They will speak to our parish about the vital importance of the Appeal in support of Catholic education.

In 2010 our school families and faculty received \$6,650 in support of tuition assistance needs and continuing education programs. The Appeals also funds the Right Start Student and Parent classes in our school, marriage preparation classes for couples in our parish, and the Good Leaders, Good Shepherds pastor training program that I am now participating through next year.

You can make your gift or pledge in the Community Center before or after Mass on Saturday or Sunday this weekend or on either of the two following weekends.

The goals for the Appeal in our parish this year are to —

- Raise **\$52,979** in gifts and pledges
- Increase participation by **48 new donors** who have never given to the Appeal or did not contribute last year

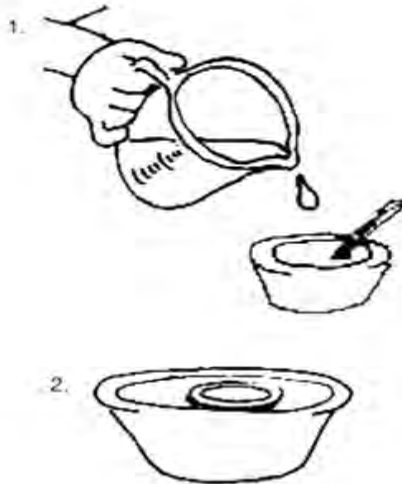

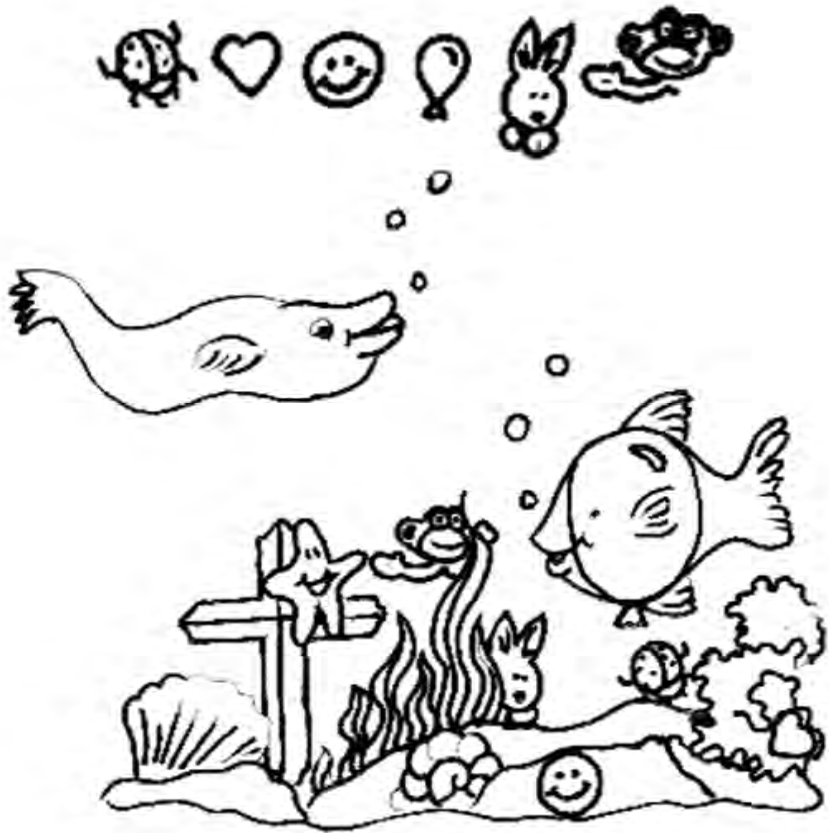

MANAGING CONGESTIVE HEART FAILURE

When we hear the term “heart failure”, it makes it sound as if the heart has stopped working. What congestive heart failure actually means is that the heart isn't pumping efficiently enough to keep up with the body's needs. If you have been diagnosed with congestive heart failure or have been told you are at risk, here is some information to help you better manage. With the proper treatment and lifestyle changes, many people with congestive heart failure can lead active lives for many years.

Heart failure occurs in stages. At the earliest stage, someone may not even notice he has heart failure, or it disappears after they begin medications. Their heart failure may never progress further if they take good care of themselves. If someone has the later stages of heart failure, they may have difficulty with everyday activities, like walking up the stairs or carrying groceries. Even later stages of heart failure can cause fluid in their lungs making them short of breath at rest and even lying down, or fluid to accumulate in the ankles and legs. At whichever stage a person is diagnosed, to keep it from worsening they will have to make major changes in their lives. They will have to eat differently, remember to take medications, keep as active as possible and reduce stress. Some of these changes will require breaking habits that have been acquired over many years. A caregiver's role is to help them maximize their quality and length of life.

Everyone diagnosed with heart failure should be under the care of a doctor. If you experience any of these worsening symptoms, call your doctor immediately.

- Sudden weight gain (greater than 3 lbs in 1-2 days)
- Increased swelling in the legs or ankles
- Shortness of breath while at rest
- A dry, hacking cough or wheezing
- Dizzy or fainting spells
- Increased fatigue or feeling unwell all the time
- Abdominal pain or swelling

What can a person do to live a healthy life with heart failure?

- Eat heart healthy—Salt is the biggest culprit so cut it out of your diet completely. Beware of high sodium processed foods.
- Get daily exercise—Many feel exercise makes their heart work too hard, but it will actually make your heart stronger.
- Stop smoking
- Wear comfortable clothes when you are retaining fluid and use pillows to elevate head at night to keep breathing easier.
- Take your medication consistently and according to instructions.

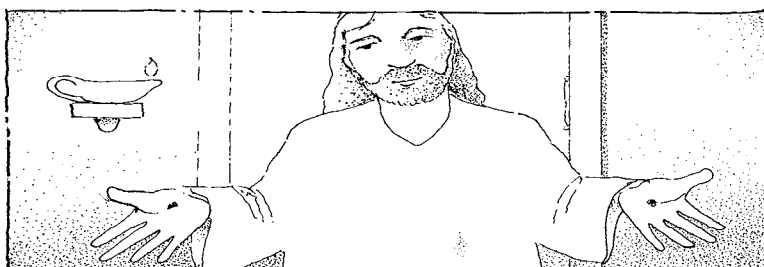
