#### Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

#### Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

COMING TOGETHER IN CHRIST—the calling and conviction of our Church from the beginning—ensures that no individual and no single parish will ever have to go through hardship alone. This weekend I am happy to welcome to our parish Ms. Peggy O'Brien, the Principal of Our Lady of Guadalupe School, together with faculty members, Kathy Long, Anne Cook, and Jessie Joiner. They will speak to our parish about the vital importance of the Appeal in support of Catholic education.

In 2010 our school families and faculty received \$6,650 in support of tuition assistance needs and continuing education programs. The Appeal also funds the Right Start Student and Parent classes in our school; marriage preparation classes for couples in our parish; and the *Good Leaders, Good Shepherds* pastor training program that I am participating in through next year.






