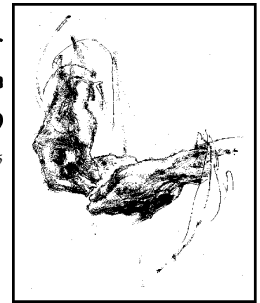

Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

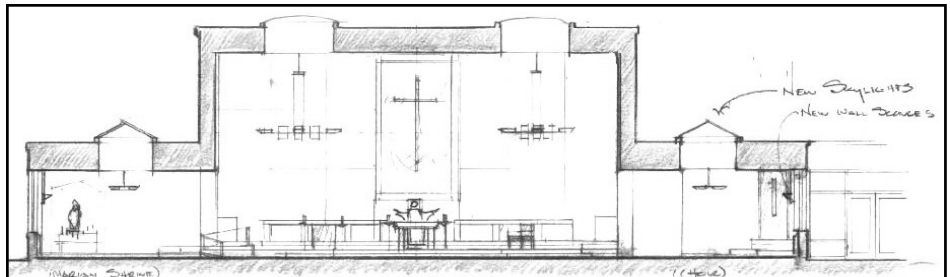

Public Presentations Scheduled for Our Parish in June Renovation Plans for Our Church & Community Center



After our Visioning Day in 2008 and a Parish Survey the following year our Parish Pastoral Council commissioned a Church Renovation Committee to “ ... review the design of our Church building to enhance worship, to create a space for fellowship, and to achieve accessibility for those with physical limitations.” The Committee has now nearly finished its work.

In January the Renovation Committee presented its work to a group of 38 parish leaders who met **to determine the benefits of this project for our parish.** They agreed that the proposed plans -

- Provide a space conducive to accessible, inclusive, full, and active participation in worship
- Eliminate physical and symbolic barriers and provides better placement for the ministries of lectors, servers, musicians, gift bearers, and Eucharistic ministers
- Strengthen the presence of our parish and our commitment to outreach in the community
- Secure viability and create a sense of pride in ownership for all parishioners

WHAT WE WANT

All parishioners are encouraged to participate in these events. We need your help to determine if these proposed plans will achieve the values that you have told us are most important to you.

**ARE YOU AT
FOR****BLOOD CLOTS/****RISK**

When a blood clot, or thrombus, forms within a deep vein it is called a deep vein thrombosis or DVT. They are deep vein blood clots, which certain health conditions or their treatments can put you at an increased risk for DVT's. They are dangerous because if they would break free from the vein wall and travel through the blood stream they could enter the lungs and become a pulmonary embolism, which can be fatal. There are 3 factors that contribute to the formation of a DVT:

- Alteration of the normal blood flow (like sitting too long without moving legs)
- Damage to the inside of the vein
- Tendency for the blood to clot too much
-

The following conditions can increase the formation of blood clots:

- Cancer
- Heart Health
- Pregnancy
- Obesity
-

Other factors that increase risk are:

- Trauma
- Surgery
- Estrogen Therapy

If you know you are at an increased risk for DVT's .watch for symptoms and notify your doctor. These are changes in skin color, increased warmth in an area, tenderness, swelling, or pain in one leg.

If you have these symptoms, a call to your doctor is the best advice.

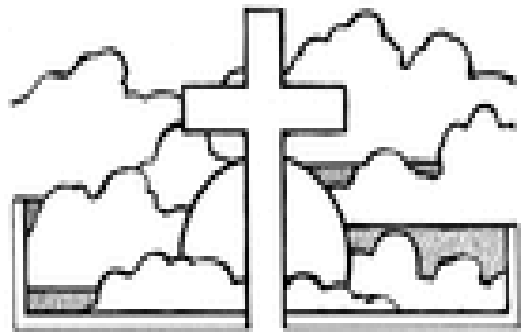

Health Screening Specialists

Most of us have witnessed the devastating effects of what heart attacks and strokes can do. Scan Specialists will be at St. Rose Philippine Duchesne Parish on June 14th performing nine ultrasound, color flow Doppler screenings.

First they will scan the arteries on both sides of the neck for fatty plaque build up and blockage, which is the number one cause of strokes. Second, they will scan the thyroid for cyst or tumors. Third, they scan the main artery off of the heart for aneurysms. They scan the liver and spleen for cyst type masses, the kidneys and the gallbladder for stones or cyst. Then finally then check the arteries of the legs for blockage.

Typically, these screenings are not done on a routine physical exam and insurance does pay for them unless you have symptoms. Average cost in a hospital is \$800 per screening. Your cost is \$45 per exam or \$189 for all 9 screenings. To take advantage of these screenings please call 1-800-931-4772 to schedule an appointment. Space is limited.

Planning with IRAs

IRA Charitable Rollovers Return with Recent Tax Legislation

In light of these turbulent economic times, donors are seeking creative ways to fund their charitable gifts. Recent legislation extends prior law that allows a useful and popular gifting technique involving IRAs, the IRA Charitable Rollover. The technique is available to donors 70 1/2 and older through December 31, 2011. The IRA Charitable Rollover provides for:

- Simpler IRA gifts that are made directly from the donor's IRA account to the charity.
- IRA gifts with potentially better tax results. (It will not be necessary in certain cases to report donated funds from an IRA as income and attempt to offset the reported income with a charitable deduction; gifted funds will simply not be included as income and no deduction is taken.)
- Gifts from donors who have not used IRAs for charitable gifts in the past. (This type of gift will particularly benefit certain donors that do not itemize or whose charitable deductions are subject to limitations.)
- Effective planning with "required minimum distributions" (RMDs) from IRAs. (The donated funds from IRAs will qualify as RMDs)
