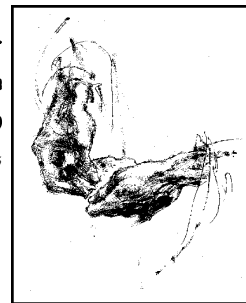

Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

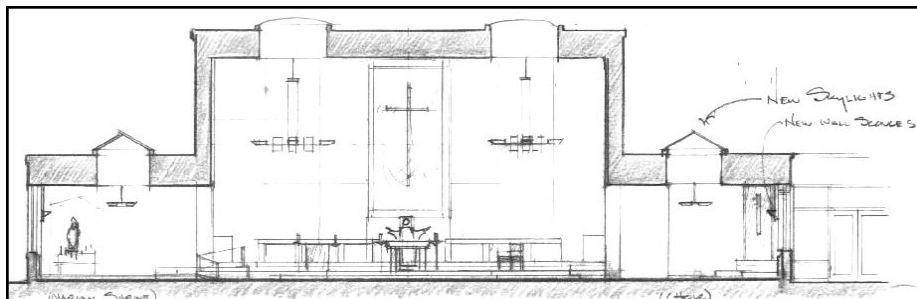

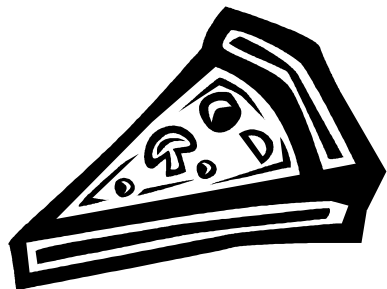

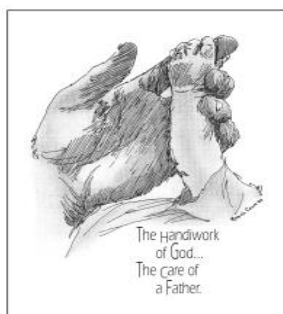

ARE YOU AT**RISK FOR****BLOOD CLOTS**

When a blood clot, or thrombus, forms within a deep vein it is called a deep vein thrombosis or DVT. They are deep vein blood clots, which certain health conditions or their treatments can put you at an increased risk for DVT's. They are dangerous because if they would break free from the vein wall and travel through the blood stream they could enter the lungs and become a pulmonary embolism, which can be fatal. There are 3 factors that contribute to the formation of a DVT:

- Alteration of the normal blood flow (like sitting too long without moving legs)
- Damage to the inside of the vein
- Tendency for the blood to clot too much
-

The following conditions can increase the formation of blood clots:

- Cancer
- Heart Health
- Pregnancy
- Obesity
-

Other factors that increase risk are:

- Trauma
- Surgery
- Estrogen Therapy

If you know you are at an increased risk for DVT's .watch for symptoms and notify your doctor. These are changes in skin color, increased warmth in an area, tenderness, swelling, or pain in one leg. If you have these symptoms, a call to your doctor is the best advice.

Eucharistic Congress

The 2011 Archdiocesan Eucharistic Congress aims to bring people closer to Jesus Christ, present in the Eucharist.

Expected to draw thousands of Catholics from all over the region, the Congress will take place Friday, June 24 thru Sunday, June 26, spread out over two locations: The Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis and St. Louis University High School.

Programming on Saturday, June 25, will be geared toward the entire family. Other special programs include one for the Hispanic community and the "Will Work for Mercy" project geared toward helping the faithful live out the corporal works of mercy.

The Congress is an opportunity for the greater community to "see what the Catholic Church is all about," said Elizabeth Westhoff, director of the archdiocese's Office of Marketing. "The Church is a community, a family with people of shared faith coming together and celebrating who we are as Catholics and the heart of our faith, which is the Eucharist."

For Catholics who attend the Congress, Westhoff said she hopes they will grow even deeper in their faith and understanding of the Real Presence in the Eucharist. "This is a great time for us as Catholics in St. Louis and the metropolitan area to focus on the fact that the Eucharist is not something we just go through the motions of receiving" at Mass. Rather, "it is the actual Body of Christ, and every time the Mass is celebrated around the world, it is the same Body of Christ that was at Calvary."

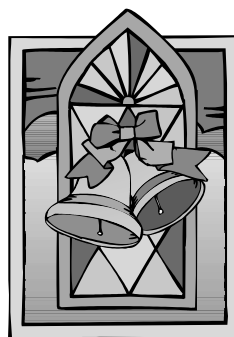
