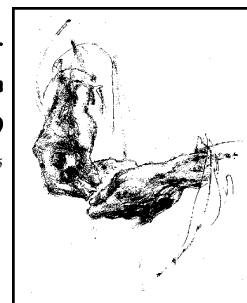

Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

NEXT WEEKEND FATHER JAMES KING'ORI, from Kenya will make an appeal in our parish for the **Consolata Missionaries**. This religious community was founded by Blessed Joseph Allamano (Turin, Italy), taking its name from the shrine of Our Lady of Consolation and the devotion and love the he had for Our Blessed Mother. They are a religious society for foreign missions, composed of priests, brothers, and sisters who devote their lives to the evangelization of people everywhere, the dream of Blessed Joseph. Working in 21 countries around the world, they serve the spiritual and temporal needs of many people in Africa, South and North America, and several European countries. Overall they have 224 Mission Centers with each Center caring for up to 100 villages. I have invited Father King to our parish as part of our annual Archdiocesan **Missionary Plan of Cooperation**—an initiative by which the Church of St. Louis offers spiritual and material support for the foreign missions. Please warmly and generously welcome Father King.

SINCE THE DEATH OF MY MOTHER my family is trying to have an **annual family reunion**. This week we are meeting in Kansas City—where my brother, Kevin, and his family live—on July 8th-11th. **Father King** will be with our parish for all the weekend Masses, and **Father David Polek, CSSR**, for weekday Masses at 8:00am on July 7th/8th and 11th/12th. Please note that there will be no 6:30am Mass on July 7th or 12th.

OUR PARISH CELEBRATES THIS WEEKEND the **First Communion** of **Teirra** and **Alanna Andrisse**. They've completed their preparation for this sacrament as students of the **Parish School of Religion** program jointly sponsored by the parishes of our Deanery. Join my in celebrating this day with their parents—William and Angela—and younger sister, Asia. As symbolized in this sacrament may they and many others be truly, richly blessed in the journey of faith we make together.

ABOUT A YEAR AGO I reported here that our parish leaders and many—if not all—of our parish members want the Catholic Church to be present and active in this part of St. Louis County for many years to come. I am convinced that we can **establish a Catholic presence and a vibrant parish** by developing **partnerships** with others who share with us the mission of Christ to the people of the communities we are here to serve. About a month ago I was contacted by Mr. Brian O'Malley, the President of **Catholic Charities**, about the possibility of using our facilities for some of the outreach programs they have to offer. He and several members of his staff came for a visit during which we talked about the needs of our parish and our community. I have received the encouragement of our Pastoral Leadership Team and our Finance Committee to continue these conversations. Over the next 6 months I expect these talks to develop and to involve more of our parish leaders. I will keep our parish up-to-date through our bulletin. During this time I will also be recruiting a small team of parishioners to help me with the reorganization and selection of a new **Parish Pastoral Council**. Each day I thank God for all the ways that you are giving of yourselves for the life and welfare of our parish. And I know that God always multiplies the fruitfulness of our giving.

COMING TOGETHER IN CHRIST we pray for and support for the work of the Church across the Archdiocese. If you are still considering what your gift or pledge may be, you will receive this month a final Appeal letter from the Archbishop. As we near our parish goals remember that your prayers and gifts help to make the love of Jesus very real for those in need.

Why did a new translation have to happen?

To answer this question, I ask another—what do we think liturgy is? In 1976, Paul Homer wrote in Worship that liturgy is not how people see things, but the purpose is how God sees all people. Our worship, our rituals are “formal”. “Formal” means that they exist to bring about life. When you worship, do you feel alive? The words we say matter! Words give birth; words transform us! Liturgy exists in order that we will abide in God. If we are being transformed, resulting in a deep change within each of us—then why shouldn’t the ritual be changed? We join a liturgy already in progress. The Trinity begins the liturgy: God’s love to Jesus, then Jesus to us, and then us with Jesus to God. We are not changing the form of the ancient liturgy; liturgy transforms us which causes its change! Words form you; words want to make you a better Church!

>In the past four years there has been approximately \$870,000 in Charitable Gift Annuities established for the benefit of parishes throughout the Archdiocese.

>The majority of annuitants establish gift annuities for the benefit of parishes at \$10,000.

>The birth years for annuitants establishing annuities for the benefit of their parish range from 1918 up to 1949 with majority of annuitants in the 1920's era. The majority were born in 1927.

>The average payout to benefiting parishes from deceased annuitants is approximately 47% of the original gift.

>Payout rates for Charitable Gift Annuities range from 5.3% to 9.8% for those 65 years or older.

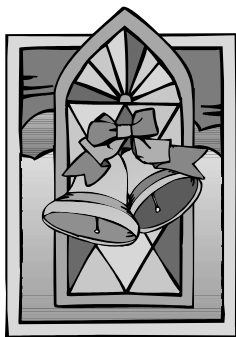

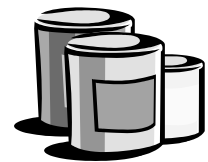
**FROM CATHOLIC CHARITIES OF ST. LOUIS
“FOOD PANTRY ALERT”**

YOUR GENEROUS SUPPORT for the food distribution programs of our parish and our archdiocese are greatly appreciated. These programs reach the most vulnerable people in our community. Earlier this month Fr. Mike received an **URGENT ALERT** from Catholic Charities that **Missouri's Food Pantry Tax Credit** program will expire on **August 28th**. Pantries across Missouri are worried about the loss of donations of food and money.

Through this program **donors** are able to **claim half of the value of their donation—up to \$2,500 a year**—as credit against their state income tax bill. Through this program the state offers \$2 million a year to encourage donations of food and money.

From what Fr Mike has learned this incentive program got lost in all the squabbling over the \$522 million worth of tax credits handed out by the state last year. The **Food Pantry Tax Credit will not be restored** without a special session of the legislature this summer which does not seem likely.

This program has grown significantly over the past 4 years with 99% of the donors being individual tax payers, claiming credits on average amounting to \$450. I would encourage your donations by August 28th to **Catholic Charities of St. Louis** in support of their food programs. After this date Missouri tax payers will not longer be able to take advantage of this tax credit program.

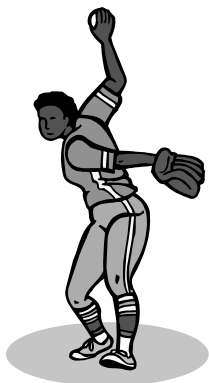
