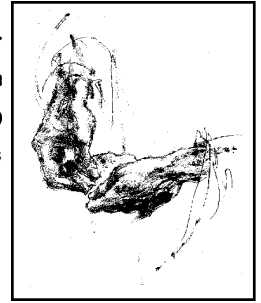

Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

As in any profession and way of life, there is a vocabulary that accompanies it. As a person lives and grows in the Church, the words unfold and their beauty will work effects on the person over generations. Currently, we have words such as “Paschal Mystery” or covenant”, etc., in our Church that people are saying and trying to understand and live. So the new words being introduced “consubstantial” or “under my roof” will also be unfolded and work their effects over generations. “Words” want to make us a better Church!

*SUMMER SKIN ALERT*

Sunburn, heat rash and bug bites can quickly wreak havoc on your summer. Here are a few ways to “fix” skin issues that may arise.

SUNBURN: If you forgot that sunscreen when in the sun for a long period of time and have a burn the best thing is to take ibuprofen or aspirin to stop pain and inflammation. Don’t scratch....that can cause infection.

Believe it or not, a natural remedy is: Dip a washcloth in cool, full-fat milk and place on sunburned spots several times a day, 5-10 minutes. The lactic acid stops inflammation and itchiness.

HEAT RASH: Sometimes called prickly heat, this rash shows up as little red bumps or blisters when sweat ducts get blocked.

A good remedy is to avoid heat and humidity as much as possible. Sprinkle rashes with powder containing cornstarch or menthol. Also, stick to natural fibers like cotton. Synthetic fabrics tend to irritate skin.

POISON IVY RASH: The leaves of poison ivy plants release an oil toxin that can leave skin red, blistering and itchy.

Wash fabrics, pets, clothes as soon as possible. Cleanse skin with lukewarm water and soap. Apply hydrocortisone cream a few times a day. If you’re itchy, also dab on an over-the-counter antihistamine cream. **DON’T SCRATCH.**

BUG BITES: Having a severe bite reaction, like nausea or breathing difficulties is cause to go to an ER. For milder cases, use hydrocortisone cream or try an anti-itch cream like calamine lotion. Avoid bug bites by using citronella insect repellent. It’s effective and safe for your skin.

Stay cool, and remember to drink lots of water.

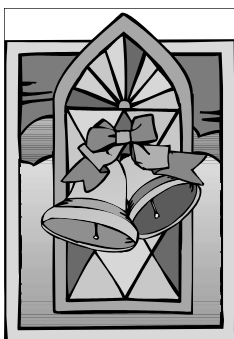

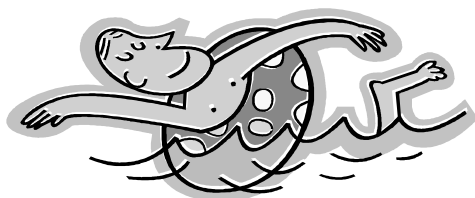
