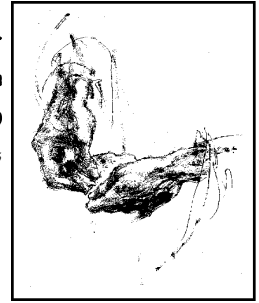

**Sacrament of Marriage**

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

**Anointing of the Sick**

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

**“Finders Keepers” — Maybe Not!**

**HUMAN BEINGS ARE VERY CLEVER** about how and what we seek as treasure. Some endanger their lives to explore the depths of the sea or desolate wilderness to recover lost riches. Some people spend every weekend going to garage sales and flea markets. Some people comb beaches or garbage dumps or city parks with metal detectors to find things of value. But to find *“the kingdom of heaven”*—*“the reign of God in our lives now and forever”*—we need a wise and understanding heart. Such a heart does not take us to a place or to things, but leads us to **seek and treasure the people in our lives** who the sign of God’s love and abiding presence.

A basic principle of human psychology reminds us that **human beings operate only through attractive images**—a principle both God and Madison Avenue know well. Images and stories convey **powerful faith insights** which shed light on human existence and the problem of evil. The imagination enlarges our **knowledge of human nature**.

As Jesus does so often, the Gospels encourage us to use **images and stories** as an essential way of understanding and teaching others about God. Our actions and ways of relating to people—**the story of who we are and how we live**—can be very attractive to others and does reveal our true values. **Faithful disciples** must be willing to give our all to encounter God’s presence in the goodness we share with others and in their goodness extended to us. In our self-giving response to the needs of others we find lasting treasure—the reign of God. Hardly something to be kept only to ourselves, if we expected **the real joy of “finders keepers”!**

**THE MASS AND EUCHARISTIC ADORATION** are important ways we have for **entering into the mind and heart of God**. Remember, for Christians Jesus is THE image of God. We have salvation because of his humanity AND his divinity. Of all the ways that God could save the world, why Jesus? **What was God thinking?** If we hope to continue Eucharistic adoration in our parish we need volunteers. If you’d like to know more about adoration or to volunteer, talk with Father Mike.

## **WAYS TO BE GOOD TO YOUR JOINTS BEYOND EXERCISE**

Taking out the trash, driving to the store, or even just walking around the house can be huge hurdles when dealing with this chronic condition. Simple adjustments can ease the stress and stiffness of your joints, making it easier to get through your day. Here are a few tips and advice for everyday living.

- 1. Keep a disk-shaped, rubber jar opener in the car, then use it when needing to twist off the gas cap when filling up at the filling station.**
- 2. Gripping a dust rag can be painful, use a dusting glove. Also, keep cleaning equipment and supplies on all levels of the house.**
- 3. Don't worry about fashion when it comes to shoes. You should wear flexible, supportive shoes that are squared or rounded at the toes so your toes can move around.**
- 4. Do your best not to live a sedentary lifestyle. Walking is a great way to get started, it is low impact activity, and just thirty minutes a day can lead to a better, overall health. Not only will walking benefit your joints, but it also burns calories, strengthens your muscle, and builds stamina and bones.**

Look for more tips on being good to your joints in 2 weeks. In the meantime, join us on Monday mornings in the Community Center for an hour of exercise that helps to loosen up our joints and help us to move easier though out the day.

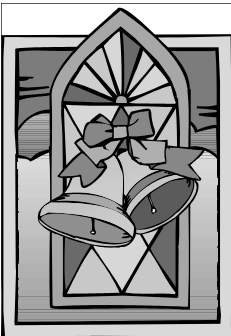

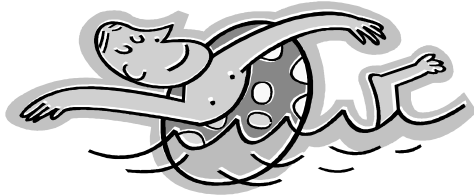

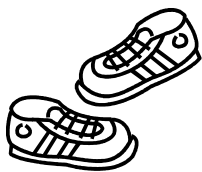
