




Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

WE OFTEN SAY THAT WE ARE "OF TWO MINDS" about something. For example whether to go out for a meal or eat in; whether to support one side of an issue or the other; whether to leave one job or to take another. Sometimes our "two mindedness" results from our being relatively indifferent about the final decision.

When it comes to putting faith into action, however, we cannot be indifferent. We can have only one mind—to **discern** and **do God's will**—because the outcome is life or death.

What does it mean to do God's will? It means to listen to the people God sends into our lives to help us understand ourselves better. The ones who call us to conversion of life, to open if not change our minds about something, or to put into action what we come to believe. Doing God's will is the "way of righteousness" that leads to growth in relationships, graciousness of actions, and integrity of character.

PARISH LEADERS WILL MEET ON MONDAY EVENING for their final discussion of the proposals for the renovation of our parish church. This group will decide if we want to do all of this project, part of this project, or to make no **improvements** to our Church or Community Center. If parish leaders decide that we want to do all or part of the proposed plan, only then will we begin to consider how and when to begin this project, including the best way to pay for it. The facilitator for our meeting will be Notre Dame Sr. Rosemary Hufker, SSND.

In March 2011 our Church Renovation Committee meet with our parish Liturgy, Finance, and Capital Improvements Committees, together with our Pastoral Council and Pastoral Leadership Team. These parish leaders determined that the proposed renovation would most benefit our parish by—

- Providing a worship space conducive to accessible, inclusive, full, and active participation
- Eliminating physical and symbolic barriers and provide better placement for the ministries of lectors, servers, musicians, gift bearers and Eucharistic ministers
- Strengthening the presence of our parish and our commitment to outreach in the community
- Securing viability and creating a sense of pride in ownership for all parishioners

I am very grateful to so many of you who took the time over the summer to view the proposed drawings and floor plans for this project and to talk with our parish leaders. Continue to pray about what is best for our whole parish community.

I REVEIVED A LETTER FROM ARCHBISHOP CALRSON this week thanking us for our generous support this year of the Annual Catholic Appeal. Despite the difficult economic times we are now experiencing the solidarity of **Catholic** across the Archdiocese enabled the Appeal to raise over \$13.3 million. Our success means that so many who depend on our Church for help will receive this year the services and support they need. A detailed report on the Appeal was published in last week's St. Louis Review. Working together we practice Christian Stewardship and can always bring Christ's love to the many communities we serve.

This year our parish raised \$53,943 in gifts and pledges, exceeding our Challenge Goal by \$964. We also had 33 new donors. Of the 747 households receiving pledge cards 354 (47.4%) were returned. Of those parishioners who participated 168 (51.2%) maintained their 2010 level of support and 130 (39.6%) increased their contributions for a net increase of \$9,013. Thanks to all who were able to participate. Special thanks again to Ray & Karin Gawedzinski, Brian & Angie Loy, Larry Abeln, and all the parish volunteers who helped with the success of our parish campaign.

FOOD EXPIRATION DATES: SHOULD YOU EAT THAT?

The expiration dates on foods reflect when to buy or use a product at its best QUALITY. So, while you won't necessarily get sick from eating expired food, its freshness and nutrient value may be diminished. The trick is to know how long a product is safe to eat after its expiration date.

Pantry foods, life cereal baking mixes and peanut butter may display "best if used by "dates. These indicate the shelf-life of a product—These food scan safely eat most of these types of foods past their listed date if they've been stored properly,

(in air tight containers) but they may not taste their best or be as nutritious. Pasta and rice maintain their taste for about a year. Unopened bags of cookies are good for a few months.

If you are confused by the language of food dates, here are some tips.

- "Sell by" date: Used by manufacturers to remind grocers when to remove products from shelves.
- "Best if used by": Refers to the flavor or quality, not food safety. Past that date, the taste and nutrient content may have diminished, but it may still be edible.

Eggs can be stores in the refrigerator 3-5 weeks after purchase. Fresh eggs have a long shelf life, as long as they are refrigerated quickly. Egg shells are porous, so as moisture leaks out of them, the quality diminishes. To help prevent this, store them in the carton.

Throw away a cracked egg if you don't know how it happened. Hard-boiled eggs that are cooled before storing in the refrigerator last up to a week.

Canned foods often are your safest food bet. They'll last as long as 5 years past the "pack date", if you pantry is cool enough.

If a can is sharply dented—or, especially, if it bulges outward—toss it immediately because there's a good chance it has been infected with life-threatening bacteria.

These are some helpful hints, however, the best rule of thumb is: WHEN IN DOUBT THROW IT OUT.

Dear Pastors and Parish Administrators,

On Sunday, October 2, 2011, there will be a special collection for the formation of permanent deacons in the Archdiocese of St. Louis. Since 1977, 392 men have been ordained as permanent deacons in the Archdiocese. There currently are 192 active deacons ordained for the Archdiocese. About 90 percent of them are married. There also are 69 retired deacons and 103 who have died since the program started here.

When a formal, reformed permanent diaconate program was initiated in the Archdiocese in January 1977, men went through a two-year formation program, with a third year of post-ordination formation. Since then, the program has gradually expanded to five years of formation, plus three more years of post-ordination formation.

Deacons serve in parishes, hospitals, archdiocesan agencies, and other organizations. Many continue to work full-time jobs, requiring them to balance family lives and professions with their ministry as a deacon.

During formation and after ordination, deacons offer their time, personal gifts and material goods to build up the Church in the Archdiocese. Their service extends into many areas of parish life, as they assist you, the pastors, and me in carrying out the mission of the Church.

I ask you to support the formation of permanent deacons by promoting the Special Collection for the Formation of Permanent Deacons on Sunday, October 2, 2011. In addition, I ask you please to support the candidates for the permanent diaconate by encouraging the faithful of your parish to pray for them.
