

Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

GOOD LEADERS GOOD SHEPHERDS is a two-year **training and formation program for pastors** of all ages and young priests preparing to become pastors. It also provides an opportunity for priests to get to know one another better and **builds networks of support** for them in their ministry. The program has six 3-4 day units and monthly group training sessions that focus on a priest's knowledge of himself as well as his ability for working with individual parish leaders and groups within the parish or community where he serves.

Each priest pays one-third of the cost of the program which is also funded by the Archdiocese and the parish or institution where he is assigned. The program receives additional support from the Vatterott Foundation of St. Louis. The group I am a part of began in fall 2010 and we will finish in spring 2012. At that time over 60 priests will have completed the program.

This coming week I will be away for our fourth session. During the week **Mass will not be celebrated in our parish church on Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday mornings**. A Communion Service will take place at **8:00am** each day. For those who would like to participate in the Eucharist on these days there will be an **8:00am Mass at Our Lady of the Rosary Parish**.

RECOGNIZING HEART FAILURE EXACERBATION

Heart failure is when the weakened heart cannot keep up with the needs of the body and the health of the person becomes compromised.

Symptoms of heart failure can worsen suddenly or over several weeks. Worsening of symptoms is known as an exacerbation or decompensation, regardless of how long it takes for symptoms to worsen. If you or someone you know has a diagnosis of heart failure, it is important that you know and recognize the signs of an exacerbation.

All of the signs and symptoms of heart failure exacerbation are important to take seriously; some are reasons to call the doctor, while others are reasons to call 911 or go to the emergency room. If you catch the worsening soon enough, sometimes changing a medication is all that is needed.

Shortness of Breath

Any noticeable change in breathing is important to pay attention to. Alert the doctor if your breathing pattern changes with your daily routine.

Weight Gain

People with heart failure should weigh themselves everyday, record daily weights and if there is a change of three pounds in 3 or less days, call the doctor.

Swelling Legs, Feet and Abdomen

This may or may not be accompanied by pain or discomfort. This swelling usually goes along with changes in weight. Alert the doctor when there is swelling noticed.

Productive Cough

A frothy phlegm with a pink or reddish color needs immediate attention.

Racing Heart

An increase in the heart rate or a "skipped" or irregular beat may be a sign of heart failure exacerbation. Call the doctor for feelings of a racing heart accompanied by dizziness.

Fatigue

If you notice increasing tiredness or weakness accompanied with other signs of an exacerbation and the tired feeling is overwhelming, call the doctor.

Symptoms of heart failure exacerbation vary from person to person, know yourself or your loved one, familiarize yourself with these signs and symptoms so you are prepared.




