

Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

FACTS FOR WOMEN

What is ovarian cancer? It is a cancer that occurs when the ovarian cells grow and divide uncontrollably. These cells then form a tumor on the ovary and can break off and spread to other areas of the body. There are many types of ovarian cancer but the most common, (85-90%) is epithelial cancer. There are no obvious symptoms for ovarian cancer because they can be symptoms of other illnesses.

The symptoms are:

- Pelvic or abdominal pain or discomfort
- Vague but persistent gastrointestinal upset such as gas, nausea and indigestion
- Frequent and /or urgency of urination not related to infection
- Unexplained weight gain or loss
- Pelvic and/or abdominal swelling, bloating and/or feeling of fullness
- Ongoing unusual fatigue
- Unexplained change in bowel habits.

Some of the risk factors are:

- Genetic predisposition
- Personal or family history of breast, ovarian or colon cancer
- Increased age
- Undesired infertility

There is no known way to prevent ovarian cancer but there is a higher survival rate with early detection. If any of the above symptoms present themselves and last more than 2 weeks see your doctor.




