






Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

Working Together To Know What God Wants - Discerning Our Next Steps Church Renovation Project Report

ON SEPTEMBER 26TH about 40 parish members serving on 6 different parish leadership groups meet to decide what we want to do concerning the renovation of our parish church. Their recommendations represent their careful consideration of the core values they identified earlier this year and their honest attention to the expressed ideas and feelings of parish members concerning these values and the proposed designs. The conversations of this evening were rooted in faith and prayer. They were also open, honest, and respectful. All of which has given me the confidence I needed to accept their recommendations and to continue moving forward with this project.

I am grateful for the leadership of **Peg Warnusz**, Chairperson of our Renovation Committee, and **Sister Rosemary Hufker**, SSND, who served as our meeting facilitator. Our meeting resulted in the following **Statements of Agreement**. I encourage you to read them carefully. Pray about them and pray for those who will continue working on this project as recommended below.

Statements of Agreement

Statement #1

We agree that the values to pursue strongly are: accessibility and outreach to our community. So let us enhance the church and community center with a redesigned connecting structure that enhances accessibility and makes the community center more serviceable to the community.

Statement #2

Abandoning the idea of the complete renovation (as suggested by the parishioners) but rather focusing on more practical changes as needs demand, e.g., restrooms, community center, narthex & choir area.

Statement #3

We recommend that part of the renovation be completed to include: restrooms, church lighting, sound system, accessibility of sanctuary, access to church & community center, kitchen while being fiscally responsible.

Statement #4

We want to strive to strengthen our Catholic presence in the community by focusing our resources on improving the community center for our own needs and outreach to the larger community.

Statement #5

Repair infrastructure to keep our parish structurally sound. Update for handicapped accessibility - ramps & bathrooms. Present a financially sound plan to support the above.

Statement #6

The overall parish consensus seems to be to avoid executing a grand project but make smaller improvements, perhaps over time. Parishioners like the basic layout of the church but recognize that accessibility in the restrooms could use improvements and seem willing to consider other changes enhancing accessibility in others areas, for example: access to the community center and improvements to lighting & sound system in the church.

Recommendations from Parish Leaders

- ♦ One person from each of the six leadership groups should meet with Father Mike to write a single statement of agreement that will be approved by all six groups. This group includes Bob Stolte (Pastoral Council), Theresa McWilliams (Pastoral Leadership Team), Ken Maue (Capital Improvements), and Peg Warnusz (Church Renovation Committee). Representatives from the Finance and Liturgy Committees will be added in the near future.
- ◆ Father Mike will then present this Consensus Statement to our **Parish Pastoral** Council for recommendations concerning the scope and feasibility of the project.
- ♦ In addition, I have decided that I will also present to our Council for their approval **a set of protocols** to be use by our Capital Improvement Committee and Finance Committee **for the implementation of the Council's recommendations**. I will consult with our Pastoral Leadership Team regarding these protocols which will respect and support the consensus agreement of our parish leaders.

FACTS FOR MEN

Have you had your prostate checked lately? Prostate enlargement happens to most men as they get older. As it grows it presses on the urethra and causes difficulty with urination and bladder problems. An enlarged prostate is called Benign prostatic hyperplasia (BPH). An enlarged prostate does not mean you have cancer or increase your risk of cancer. However, it is a good idea to have this checked. Talk to you physician about it.

Some signs of BPH are:

- Slowed or delayed start of the urinary stream
- Weak urine stream
- Dribbling after urination
- Straining to urinate
- Strong and sudden urge to urinate
- Incomplete emptying of the bladder
- Needing to urinate 2 or more times per night
- Urinary retention (complete inability to urinate)
- Incontinence
- Pain with urination or bloody urine.

Again, these do not necessarily mean that you have cancer. But it you do have any of these symptoms, over a period of more than 2 weeks, your physician should be contacted.

TEACHERS CONTINUE PLT PARTICIPATION

Teachers from all of the Federation schools continue to participate in their Professional Learning Teams (PLT) as part of their ongoing professional development.
