




Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

WE ARE CATHOLIC. WELCOME HOME! As you are aware we are now in the early stages of preparing for a major effort on the part of our Church to encourage active Catholics to more deeply appreciate the gift of their faith, to invite those who have left the Church or simply drifted away to take another look at practicing their faith, and to offer the community of our faith to those who have no Church.

One part of this initiative was the gathering of information over the past few weeks on the practice of attending Sunday Mass among our parish members. Over the coming year this base-line of information will be one way for us to know the success of our efforts. This is what we've learned from our recent Mass census count. Over a three-week period on average 466 people attend Mass here each weekend, roughly 30% of the total number of registered individual members of our parish. Currently our parish has 947 registered households and 1557 (*) individual members. Over this period actual Mass attendance ranged from a high of 178 persons to a low of 127, with each particular Mass averaging 160 (5:00pm), 130 (8:00am), and 177 (10:30am). Factors that may be related to attendance could be: fine weather, no special events in the parish or community, ordinary levels of parish activity, and the baseball playoff and world series weekends.

The devotion and commitment of our members to attending Mass is encouraging for me. Please do all you can to continue to participate in the celebration of Mass with our community. I also encourage all to think about your individual attitudes and practices regarding our need to be a hospitable and welcoming community - with each other and especially with anyone who may be a stranger to you.

(*) We believe that this represents only about 75% of the actual number of people who belong to our parish. We are still in the process of re-building our parish census records which were lost last year with the failure of our computer backup system and procedures.






WANTED: Photographs of Family and Friends Who Have Died

Mindful Prayer-Walk

As ministers of healing, parish nurses, clergy and others know that exercise is beneficial for good health. Exercise increases the levels of norepinephrine in our brains, which helps to reduce stress. This is similar to the effect of some anti-depressants, which also increase the concentrations of the same norepinephrine in the brain.

As media readers and watchers, we all are aware that aerobic-type exercise releases chemicals in the brain that helps the body mend itself from some of the harmful effects of stress. We also know that in order for aerobic exercise to be most effective, it must be done at least 3 times per week.

As ministers of healing, we also know that prayer changes us-blesses us, guides us, challenges us, leads us on. One way to get our daily exercise and to spend more time with in prayer is through spiritual discipline of prayer-walking.

What follows is a suggestion for spending a half-hour in meditative prayer-walking, based on the Creation narratives in Genesis. It invites the walker to spend about five minutes reflecting mindfully on each of the following seven aspects of the narratives. The last five minutes is for quiet rest, following the half hour prayer-walk.

- 1. THE STIRRING-the Spirit of God was moving (Genesis 1:1)
- 2. BREATH OF GOD-then God formed a person of dust from the ground and breathed into Humankind the breath of life.(Genesis2:4b-7)
- 3. SURROUNDED BY CREATION-and out of the ground God made to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight and good for food... (Genesis 2:8-9a)
- 4. INTERIOR AWARENESS-the tree of life also in The midst of the garden...(Genesis 2:9b)
- 5. STRUGGLE-and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil...(Genesis 2:9b)
- 6. SACRED NATURE OF RELATIONSHIPS-God created people in God's own image... (Genesis 1:27)
- 7. REST– God rested on the seventh day...God blessed the seventh day and hallowed it. (Genesis 2:3)

What better time to begin a mindful prayer-walk than after Thanksgiving and at the beginning of Advent. Not only will the walking benefit you physically and hopefully improve your health, but the prayer and meditation will strengthen and heal your soul.

May this Advent season bring you much joy and peace! Blessings and happiness to all,

Dear Friends in Christ,

In 2010, while visiting a senior-care facility, our Holy Father Pope Benedict XVI noted, "Indeed, the provision of care for the elderly should be considered not so much an act of generosity as the repayment of a debt of gratitude." The following story about Shirley Loy's faith and dedication to the parish have been repeated due to an error last week that did not print the entire story.

Shirley Loy

Shirley and her husband Henry moved to St Pius and Glasgow Village in 1964 with four children. After moving there Shirley and her husband, who is a convert to the Catholic faith, were blessed with a daughter and then a son eight years later. That son, Brian (also a parishioner with his wife Angie) was a surprise but he has been a great joy, as well. Shirley and Henry have been married for fifty-seven years! They had lived in two parishes prior to St. Pius, Holy Cross and St

Catherine. Shirley says that her faith developed so much due to her pastor, Monsignor Hellriegel. She still has little ways of doing things that were taught way back then, that help to make the liturgy more meaningful to her.

Listening to Shirley talk about some of the ways her faith comes alive I was moved by how she thinks of them as just "habits" that have become part of what she does each week. She is the Treasurer of Saint Vincent DePaul, organizes a team for funeral luncheons, is a member of the Ladies Guild, brings Communion to the nursing home folks and



to a neighbor, drives someone to church each week, does an hour in Adoration and still finds time for her children, the grandchildren and now great-grandchildren. Each task was just added as needs arose in the parish. When asked how she got involved in SVDP she said that a neighbor came to her after her husband got viral encephalitis and wanted to know if she needed assistance since she had such a large family. Shirley said they didn't take the help because she had started to work and they were doing alright. She said, "You don't take what you don't need". Later, Bert asked if she would come and help out with SVDP and finally she did. She said that working with those she served often fills her with emotion and satisfaction because she was helping someone who really needed it. Shirley said that some people affect you more than others...the ones that couldn't get by without your help.

Shirley said that many things don't take a lot of your time...an hour here or there, but they may make a big difference in the life of someone else. You can see the joy it brings to her days!
