




Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

Taking the Risk of "Cleverness"

We are Baptized "Apprentices of the Master"

IN THE MIDDLE AGES there was a unique relationship between a master and an apprentice. Whatever the commission or project the master always took responsibility for the mistakes of the apprentice. In turn, the general public only knew - and history would only remember - the name of the master. Such trust often - if not always - brought the best out of an apprentice. Each of us should spend some time letting this really sink into our minds and hearts. Such an attitude on the part of our Master should truly liberate us to be good and even more to explore the limits of being better and best in living out our faith.

St. Matthew's parable reminds us of an important belief of the early Church: God judges us not by how much or little we have but by how faithful we are in using what we have to build up God's kingdom. Failure is not this issue. Fear that keeps us from acting is! In particular for those who have been "apprenticed" to Jesus the Master by baptism, the risk of "cleverness" is always preferable to "playing it safe".

LATE THIS SUMMER we discovered several leaks in the roof of our Parish Community Center, the largest building of our parish complex. A careful inspection of the roof identified about two dozen cracks or breakdowns in the roofing material. Temporary patches were immediately put in place. Steve Jones, our Maintenance Coordinator, and Mike Petroff, Chairperson of our Capital Improvements Committee, also determined that the roof is about 20 years old and that all warranties on materials and installation had expired. From previous assessments we also knew that this roof would possibly need to be replaced within the next 2-3 years, and some planning for this was already underway.

Over the past two months the CIC received and discussed three bids on replacing the roof and at the end of October made their recommendation to the Parish Finance Committee which approved their work. As an ordinary matter of due diligence these bids and our financing proposal were reviewed by the Archdiocesan Office of Building and Real Estate as well as the Archdiocesan Finance Office. With their support a contract for the replacement of this roof was signed this week.

We have chosen Allied Roofing and Exteriors Inc. for this project at a cost of \$81,480. The work will begin within the next several weeks and will take about three weeks to complete. This project is an unexpected expense for our parish this year and will be paid for from our parish reserve funds (savings). During the coming weeks I would ask that you pray for good weather and for the safety of the workers on this project. Thank God as well for their skills and experience. Pray that they experience pride and satisfaction in their work - a blessing in their lives as well as on us. If you have any questions about this project, please speak with either Mike Petroff, or **concerning its financing**, with Bill Krenn, Chairperson of our Finance Committee.

For the Mission of Christ in the Communities Served by Our Parish **Parish Reserve Funds**

OUR PARISH SAVINGS are the result of the 2005-2006 consolidation of parish assets and sale of parish properties. Since 2005 we have also received several bequests and estate gifts that have added to our savings. As of the end of October

our parish has \$3,802,840 on deposit in the St. Louis Archdiocesan Fund. These funds are kept in demand and money market accounts as well as certificates of deposit, and are overseen by our Parish Finance Committee.

Every year in addition to your Sunday offerings we need to use our savings to help pay for the services received by our parish members and the operation of our parish facilities. In addition, since 2005 we have used our savings for all capital improvement needs. The present and future vitality of our parish depends not only on the wise use of these funds, but also on the continuing generosity of our parish members each week and at times their extraordinary giving. This will enable us to conserve and add to our savings. Daily I thank God for each of you and pray that all the ways of our giving will be a blessing on us and many others.

CARE FOR THE CAREGIVER

10 RESOURCES FOR IN-HOME CARE HELP

I know we have talked about this before, but we are all caregivers now or will be at some point in our life. Many of us, when we are asked to be a caregiver, tend to learn as we go along. We are not given a manual that gets us through our days of care giving. Many times we need help and don't always know where to go for that help. Here are 10 resources that can help you meet your responsibilities and make you feel less alone.

• Companion care services

These companies provide companions for shut-ins who are frail or have a dementia-like illness or live alone.

• Personal care assistants

In addition to providing companion care, personal care assistants offer assistance with activities of daily living.

Adult day services

Also called adult day health services, adult daycare, or respite care, these services provide care and supervision outside the home for older adults with physical and mental limitations.

Home health agencies

These companies are the go to source when your loved one needs a higher level of care, including minor medical care.

• Local Area Agency on Aging

This is a government-mandated clearinghouse for general information about nearby eldercare services. For many caregivers, this would be your first call for information on eldercare in your area.

I will list the remaining 5 resources in my next article. You have two great resources here in your parish, Sister Rose and Buffy. Please call for help when you are feeling overwhelmed as a caregiver, and we will guide you in the right direction.
