

### Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding.

Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

### Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

### **Celebrating the Season of Advent Each of Us - "A Work in Progress"**

**THE PROPHET ISAIAH OFFERS A WONDERFUL IMAGE** as we begin to prepare spiritually for the Season of Christmas. *"We are the clay and you the potter. We are all the work of your hands."* **We are clay in the hands of God!**

Working with clay takes physical strength to knead and soften the material, to center it on the potter's wheel, and to shape it for a pleasing or useful purpose. Though I may be hard headed or cold hearted, I am not unworkable. **The hands of God are strong and untiring.** Working with clay takes a good eye for the beauty in the most practical of objects or pleasing works of art. Though I may not easily or any longer see it in myself, I am not unworkable. **The hands of God are constantly re-creative and imaginative.** Working with clay takes the patience of not having something right now or perfect. Though I may be demanding or unforgiving with myself or others, I am not unworkable. **The hands of God are gentle and sure.**

This is a good time of year for remembering how good it is to put yourself into the hands of God. One way you might consider doing this is in the celebration of the Sacrament of Penance. **Most Catholics need to rediscover the value of this sacrament in their lives.** Most want to and tell me that it's been way too long in coming. Most find that it's easier to do than they thought.

If you're interested in taking this step my best advice came long ago came from some 2nd graders. Their definition for the word **"confession"** was pretty simple: **"tell the whole truth about yourself"**. What they meant was this. Yes, there's **"sin"** in the story of our lives, but there's also **"grace"** - all the good that God has given me and has been doing through me. This is why little kids smile so much after confession and some grown ups talk about finding joy in their life again.

If you think you're ready for this, here's three simple questions these same kids came up with to prepare:

- What have I done wrong that I'm sorry for?
- What do I need God's help with in my life?
- What am I most thankful for today?

#### **WE WATCH ARDENTLY**

## CARE FOR THE CAREGIVER

### 10 RESOURCES FOR IN-HOME CARE HELP, PART 2

Being a caregiver is no easy task. Whether you are placed in that role for only a few days or several years, it takes a lot of energy and produces much stress. Two weeks ago, I presented 5 in-home care resources to assist any caregiver with help outside the home. I will complete that list this week. Save these lists and share them with family and friends.

- **GERIATRIC CARE MANAGERS**

They assess needs and identify and coordinate resources for older adults. They can take over nearly all aspects of eldercare in some cases.

- **SENIOR MOVE MANAGERS**

Senior move managers help plan and manage a move of any distance, such as from a longtime home to a communal living situation.

- **ELDER LAW ATTORNEYS**

These professionals are lawyers who specialize in legal and financial matters that are especially relevant to older adults, and to their families.

- **FAMILY MEDIATORS**

They are lawyers, social workers, or other professionals with special training in the fine art of negotiation and compromise. They work with families to solve problems that are highly emotional and polarized.

- **SENIOR HOME REMODELERS**

They are builders and home repair services that specialize in retrofitting homes to make them safe and accessible; many also create new construction with eldercare needs in mind.

Not all these resources are for everyone. Assess your particular situation and decide which resources or services would be beneficial to you and your loved one at any given time. If you have questions, don't hesitate to call.


