




## Becoming a Catholic Christian

#### Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

#### Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

Evangelization Boot Camp Exercise #17

Reaching Out to Someone Who's Been Away from the Catholic Church How to Start a Conversation

**BEGINNING ON DECEMBER 16th** through January 22nd television commercials will be seen throughout our Archdiocese inviting your relatives, friends, and others to return home to the Catholic Church. The success of our effort depends on your prayer, but also on the particular actions you might take to personalize this invitation.

Here are some **Sample Questions and Conversation Starters** that may help you invite someone back to the Catholic Church. Read over these suggestions. Rephrase them using your own words, if these seem awkward. Once you get talking just let your conversation take the most natural, comfortable course you can create. Be a good listener. Try not to be defensive or get argumentative.

Remember most of the people you want to speak with have at least some - if not a lot of - experience with the Church. And, most people return to the Church - at least for another look - simply because someone like you invited them back.

- What do you think of those commercials about the Catholic Church that have been running on TV lately?
- What would you say is your main reason for not going to church anymore?
  - I've got some problems with the Church, but I still go? (Insert some reasons why you do). Help me understand why you feel that not going keeps you close to God?
- A lot of people think that going to Church is not necessary to have a close relationship with God.

  Could you help me understand how a person's faith life is richer when they are apart from the life and worship of a Christian community?
- What other things in our culture, besides the Church, give us a stronger set of values, a more faithful - though imperfect - group of people who care about us, and a tradition of standing up for what is right and helping others?

- (For a family member)
  You know I love you and I always will. You know I really believe that Christ wants us to practice our Catholic faith. Sometimes I worry that after we die we might end up separated from one another.
  Can you help me with my worry?
- (If they say that Jesus doesn't care if people go to Church, ask them)
  Jesus gave us the Eucharist and wanted us to worship together.
  Once we know about the Eucharist, help me understand how we go to heaven without taking part in it, without doing what Jesus asks?
- What would the Church have to change in order for you to become an active Catholic again?
- What would it take for me to convince you to come to Mass with me for a couple of weekends and see if it's something you and your family would like to get involved in again?

**PARENTS AND GRANDPARENTS** - Since many Catholics between the ages of 25 and 45 use computers and the internet quite a lot in their personal and professional lives, please try to **make sure that your children and grandchildren know about this web site**. #### Catholic Questions - On Changes in the Mass

**SEVERAL WEEKS AGO** I mentioned that **adults learn best** when the teacher begins with **the questions they really have**, rather than with what the teacher thinks they should know. As we continue to **experience the revised Mass prayers** and the **practice of celebrating Mass together**, pay close attention for the questions you may have. Write them down as soon as possible, so you won't forget. Put them in the collection or send them in, and we'll write back in the Sunday bulletin. We also want to hear your comments about what you "get out of Mass" and/or the challenge it can be sometimes "getting into Mass". Together, from our experience, the more we ask and the more we share, the more we will learn. And the more we will grow in faith, together.



# STUDENTS HELP FEED THE HUNGRY THIS THANKSGIVING AND ADVENT SEASON

As schools **Alive in Christ!**, our north county Catholic Schools live out Jesus' gospel message in many ways. Every school offers some way for students and families to help feed the hungry, for example:

Mark Ullrich before it was delivered to T.E.A.M., the Emergency Assistance Ministry serving North County.

# LOCAL BUSINESSES AND COMMMUNITY LEADERS INVEST TO EXPAND HORIZONS FOR STUDENTS

Students in our Catholic schools have many learning opportunities that result from the generosity and investment of local businesses and community organizations. One example of a successful school and business partnership is the School Branch program by Gateway Metro Credit Union. The program started at Our Lady of Guadalupe School (OLG) when Gateway Metro merged with a credit union that had been established at the parish. School branches are now open at OLG, St. Ferdinand, Christ Light of the Nations and Trinity High School.

Each branch is open once a week during lunchtimes. Gateway Metro puts the first \$5 in the student's account to get them started on saving. They offer a 10% youth CD to children ages 10-18. The students who open these accounts get to see how different interest rates affect your savings balance and how 10% really helps your money grow. The children love coming into the branch and checking their account balances and asking financial questions. "Without the school branch some of the children might not get the opportunity to have an account or a chance to acquire this financial knowledge," said Linda Miller, Director of Administration at Gateway Metro. "Learning about money is one thing they will use their whole lives."

Other examples of successful partnerships are:

- At Blessed Teresa of Calcutta School, students recently performed Godspell as part of a program with Stages St. Louis.
- The Florissant Police Department sponsors the D.A.R.E program for students in fifth grade.

Our schools are also grateful for the many other local businesses who offer support with contributions, in-kind donations to fundraisers, and much more.

# TRINITY HIGH SCHOOL OFFERS INCENTIVE TO NORTH COUNTY EIGHTH GRADERS

Trinity Catholic High School, located in the Northeast Deanery on Redman Rd., has a special incentive program for eighth grade students this year. The "33% Incentive" is offered for all 10 Catholic elementary schools in North County (the eight Federation schools plus St. Ann and St. Rose Academy).
