

Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

Quick-Start Annulment Program

IF YOU DESIRE THE SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE as a divorced or separated Catholic and want to better understand what you may need to do in order to receive this Sacrament, take some time to think and pray about attending one of the Quick-Start sessions listed below. CARBON MONOXIDE SAFETY TIPS

Often called the “silent killer,” carbon monoxide is an odorless, colorless gas created when such fuels as gasoline, wood, coal, natural gas, propane, oil or methane burn incompletely.

In the home heating and cooking equipment that burns fuel can be a source of carbon monoxide.

Here are some safety tips regarding carbon monoxide:

- *Install a battery-operated carbon monoxide detector in your home and check it when you change the time each spring and fall.*
- *Read and follow the manufacturer’s instructions for placement and appropriate mounting height of your alarms.*
- *If your alarm sounds, immediately leave your home and move to a fresh-air location outdoors or by an open window. Call for help from a fresh-air location.*
- *To warm a vehicle, remove it from the garage immediately after starting it.*
- *Never use a generator, inside your home.*
- *Never burn anything in a stove or fireplace that isn’t vented.*
- *Seek prompt medical attention if you suspect carbon monoxide poisoning and are feeling dizzy, light-headed or nauseous.*






