

### Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

### Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

**THE WORDS AND ACTIONS OF A PARISH** always have authority and power for good when we have the best interest of others at heart. Christian faith has no hidden agendas. We know this - and others discover this - when our actions are consistent with our words, when our care and compassion are evident without prejudice, when the good of others is our primary concern. The authority of Jesus was deeply rooted not only in his divine nature but also in his striving to be authentically human in such ways as this. Jesus' public ministry had people and their lives at the very center of its concern.

As a parish we must always strive to be so in tune with the people around us and their lies that we too can speak and act with the same authority and integrity of life that Jesus did. In doing so we will continue to discover that love begets life.

**VOCATIONS ARE THE RESPONSIBILITY** of the community. All of us play an important part in helping young people know what God is calling them to do with their life. Each year our Archbishop offers a **Priesthood Discernment Retreat** for young men between the ages of 18 and 30 who think they may have a vocation to the ordained priesthood. The Archbishop relies upon us to invite young men to make this retreat. This year's retreat will take place on Saturday, **February 18th**. If you know someone whom you think would make a good priest, encourage them to attend. You may also want to encourage them to talk with me if they seem open to the possibility or need more information. I would also be happy to invite anyone that you think would be a good candidate.

**PASSING ON THE GIFT OF FAITH** and the sureness of God's love is the **primary mission** of our school and a **sign of the vitality of the Church** in our community. There will be an **Open House** at our school this Sunday, **January 29th**, 1:00-3:00pm. **Encourage families** in your neighborhood - Catholic and non-Catholic - to explore the benefits of our school. We have more resources to help them than ever before. **Visit our school this Sunday** whether you have children at home or not. I guarantee that you will be filled with pride, joy, and hope for our future as **an evangelizing parish**.

**I THANK GOD FOR YOUR GENEROSITY** on behalf of the life and welfare of our parish. Without your prayers, participation, and financial support **the mission of Christ** on behalf of the communities we serve would not be possible. In addition to your involvement in parish activities and your generosity in our Sunday collection, the success of this year's **Year End Gift Campaign** is a clear sign of your commitment to the Church and the work of our parish. We received \$4,216 from 68 contributing parish members. Of this total \$3,086 (73%) was designated by donors for parish operations and \$1,130 (27%) for tuition assistance support for our school families. The majority of gifts (74%) were under fifty dollars and the expenses of the campaign (printing and mailing) amounted to \$520 - 12% of revenues received. May God continue to bless our being here and be our hope as we follow Christ striving not to count the cost.

## .FINDING EARLY SIGNS OF SKIN CANCER

*We take good care of our skin with washing and moisturizing and maybe even using sunscreen on a regular basis. However, it is important to take the time to check skin for signs of cancer.*

*Like any other cancer, it is best to find skin cancer as early as possible. Symptoms can vary depending on the type of cancer. Here are a few signs making a trip to the doctor necessary:*

- *Waxy-looking raised bumps especially on face, neck, arms or hands.*
- *Hard, red bumps on face, neck, arms or hands.*
- *Persistent, scaly patch of skin not soothed by lotion*
- *Mole that changes in size or begins to bleed.*
- *Mole with an irregular border.*

*Skin cancer can be found just about anywhere on your body, but is most often spotted on the sun exposed areas. Skin cancer can affect any type of skin tone, any race or gender.*

*Despite the abundance of evidence linking unprotected sun exposure to skin cancer, all types of skin cancer diagnosis are on the rise. Some studies find that the diagnosis has risen more than 300% since 2000. Rates of melanoma, the most dangerous type and most common in young adults, have steadily risen for the past 30 years.*

*So take care...protect yourself from over exposure to the sun and be aware of changes in any skin blemishes.*




