

Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

Becoming An Evangelizing Community**The Power of Being a 'Real Presence'**

HOW IS IT THAT WE KNOW THE TRUTH of the saying, “*Absence makes the heart grow fonder.*” I believe that our experience teaches us that we can resist the doubt of ‘absence’. Experience promises recovery from the trauma that may tempt us toward discouragement or despair. Experience even trains us to know that we have within us a power to change the human condition. We know these things even more surely if we add to our experience the gift of faith - the sureness of the love of God.

Let me demonstrate. Occasionally I will ask the surviving spouse after the loss of their loved one, “*On the day of your marriage, you knew this painful day was coming. So if you had it to do all over again, would you?*” Their response is always immediate and strong, without second thought, “*Yes!*” What a mystery! You can talk about it, explain it, but there’s always something unknown, something more to learn. We are all called to cultivate the sureness of love - each others and God’s - lest we think it’s not there when we need it most. We are called to give our hearts to God that we might be ‘the real presence’ of Christ when ‘absence’ in the lives of others tempts them not to believe or just simply to give up on themselves or others.

The more sure we are of each other’s love and of God’s the more likely that we’ll not jump to the conclusion that we are not loved when we seemingly experience its absence.

WE BELIEVE IN THE SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE. When a man and woman exchange their vows and consummate their marriage - words and actions of consecration - they are the ‘real presence’ of Jesus Christ and may be the only ‘holy communion’ some may ever receive. An awesome mystery! This is why our Catholic community gives so much attention to helping engaged couples prepare for marriage and to supporting those who are married. This weekend parish members **John and Karen Kulla** will speak at all our Masses about the value of the **Marriage**

Encounter Movement. These weekends are designed for couples who have good marriages and desire a better, more faith-filled marriage. I encourage our parish members who are married to carefully consider what they have to say and to pray for the grace to know if this is something God may want you to experience. Also, please encourage your married children to think about making a weekend and offer to support them if they do.

VOCATIONS ARE THE RESPONSIBILITY of the community.

We help young people know what God wants them to do with their life. Each year our Archbishop offers a **Priesthood Discernment Retreat** for young men (ages 18 to 30). He relies on us to invite young men to make this retreat, this year on Saturday, **February 18th**. If you know someone whom you think would make a good priest, encourage them to attend and encourage them to talk with me for more information. I would also be happy to invite anyone that you think would be a good candidate.



2012 is an important year in American politics and the St. Louis County Board of Elections is looking for members of the public to staff as many as 450 polling locations.


