Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

Becoming An Evangelizing Community

Christian Morality - The Adventure of a Lifetime

FROM MY EXPERIENCE TEACHING salvation history with fifth grade religion students I started to think that as Catholics we need to take a much more positive view on morality - being moral people and developing moral values. With my students we shifted our notion of "conscience" away from that "little voice that keeps us out of trouble" to a richer understanding that God has given every human person a "positive, creative power for creating and redeeming our world". God wants our world to have its original grace and beauty. And, God has gifted us with good minds and free will capable of great love. These children helped me to think about morality as an opportunity - an adventure - as much as an obligation.

With them I also came to be sure of two other things. First, this is a "lifetime" adventure. A person grows in goodness, even perfection, with consistent effort and good teachers, but only over time. I also learned that when people work together to make good moral decisions - for as hard as this may sometimes be - we achieve greater goodness sooner than we might think possible. Morality is **the work of a community** much more than any single person alone.

Finally, our belief that God absolutely respects human freedom (free will) always seemed to leave them speechless. As we talked about this they clearly sensed how inviting and how frightening this might be for them as they grew older. God never twisted anyone's arm to do anything! But, God has faithfully and generously promised to be gracefully with us as we strive for perfection together.

As you read Archbishop Carlson's letter in today's bulletin, please keep these things in mind. Often our Catholic Church as well as other faith communities are accused of "imposing morality". To attempt to do so would be sinful as well as unconstitutional. We must respect each other's human freedom and the freedom of all persons as God does our own. However, our constitution also guarantees religious freedom - that in our country every person of faith and every faith community has the right to be a part of the conversation (political life and activity) about ideas, values, and choices. The more people there are honestly striving for goodness and knowledge of the truth the more perfect our world will be. I encourage you to join me in responding to our Archbishop's request to pray and fast that God will help us all to be a part of the political conversation. What we believe and value must always be spoken for the sake of a more just world.





Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I write to you concerning an alarming and serious matter that negatively impacts the Church in the United States directly and that strikes at the fundamental right to religious liberty for all citizens of any faith. The federal government, which was formed to be "of, by, and for the people," has just dealt a heavy blow to almost a quarter of those people-the Catholic population-and to the millions more who are served by the Catholic faithful.

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services announced last week that almost all employers, *including Catholic employers*, will be *forced* to offer their employees health coverage that includes sterilization, abortion-inducing drugs, and contraception. Almost all health insurers will be *forced* to include those "services" in the health policies they write. And almost all individuals will be *forced* to buy that coverage as a part of their policies.

In so ruling, the Administration has cast aside the First Amendment to the Constitution of the United States, denying to Catholics our nation's first and most fundamental freedom, that of religious liberty. And, as a result, unless the rule is overturned, we Catholics will be compelled either to violate our consciences or to drop health coverage for our employees (and bring about the consequences for all in doing so). The Administration's sole concession was to give nonprofit employers, like hospitals and universities, which do not currently provide such coverage, one year in which to comply.

We believe this new requirement signals a direct attack on our religious freedom. People of faith cannot be made second-class citizens. We are already joined by our brothers and sisters of all faiths and many others of good will in this important effort to regain our religious freedom. Our parents and grandparents did not come to these shores to help build America's cities and towns, its infrastructure and institutions, its enterprise and culture, only to have their posterity stripped of their God-given right. In generations past, the Church has always counted on the faithful to stand up and protect her sacred rights and duties. I hope and trust she can count on this generation of Catholics to do the same. Our children and grandchildren deserve nothing less.

An, therefore, I would ask of you two things. <u>First</u>, as a community of faith, we must commit ourselves to prayer and fasting, that wisdom and justice may prevail, and religious liberty may be restored. Without God, we can do nothing; with God, nothing is impossible. <u>Second</u>, I would also recommend visiting <u>www.usccb.org/conscience</u>, to learn more about this severe assault on religious liberty and how to contact Congress in support of legislation that would reverse the Administration's decision.

I call upon each of you to join me and the Bishops of the United States in speaking out on this violation of religious freedom and conscience by contacting your U.S. Representatives and our U.S. Senators. Every Catholic has the responsibility to promote the dignity of human life and religious freedom. If we do not make our voices hear, no one else will. Let us work together to preserve the freedoms our forefathers established in our Constitution!


