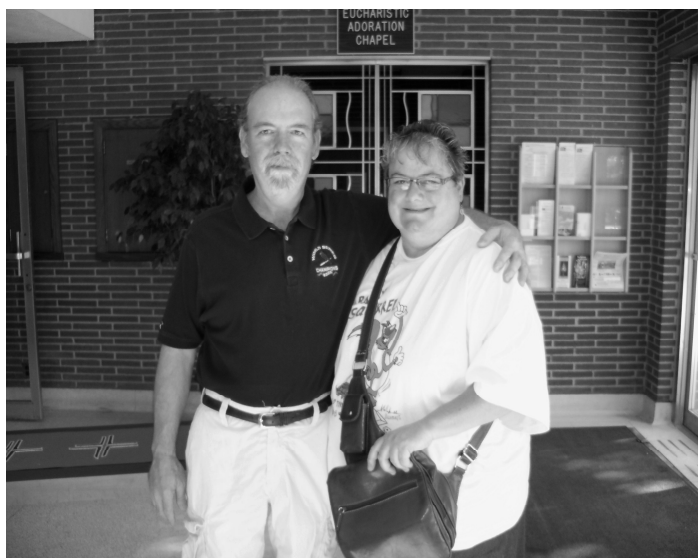

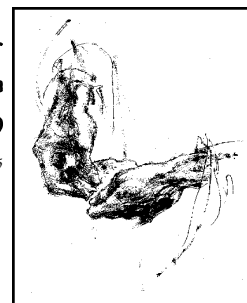

Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

Our Re-Calling to Conversion and Discipleship

WE ARE CATHOLIC. WELCOME HOME! In October we began an initiative to encourage active Catholics to more deeply appreciate the gift of their faith, to invite those who have left the Church or simply drifted away to take another look at practicing their faith, and to offer the community of our faith to those who have no Church. Hospitality in words and actions - especially at Mass and parish events - is the single most important factor for the success of this initiative. Also good celebrations of the Liturgy, effective preaching, and parish members reaching out to their neighbors are necessary elements for growth and a strong sense of belonging. Our commitment in these areas must be consistent and for the long haul of years to come.

Mass attendance is one way for us to measure the success of our efforts. We have just completed our second Mass Count, assessing the practice of attending Sunday Mass among our parish members. Over a three week period in January/February we found that our parish had on average **522 people attending weekend Masses here**, a **10.7% increase** from our count in October (466) - roughly **32.9%** of our total number of members (**1589**) from **959** registered households. Over this period **actual Mass attendance ranged from a high of 204 persons to a low of 143**, with each particular Mass averaging 190 (4:00pm), 153 (8:00am) and 179 (10:30am).

I find this very encouraging. Please do all you can to continue to participate in the celebration of Mass with our community! Encourage your family, friends, and neighbors. Practice hospitality with each other and especially with anyone who may be a stranger to you.

WE BEGIN THE SEASON OF LENT this week - our annual parish retreat in preparation for the renewal of our baptismal promises on Easter. I encourage you to use this time for personal prayer, study, and works of charity that will enliven you in Christ. After Ash Wednesday I will be on a week-long retreat. During the First Week of Lent there will be changes in our Mass schedule. These will be published in next week's bulletin. Please pray for me and I will for you and all who depend on our parish being here.

Use hand sanitizer at church entrances

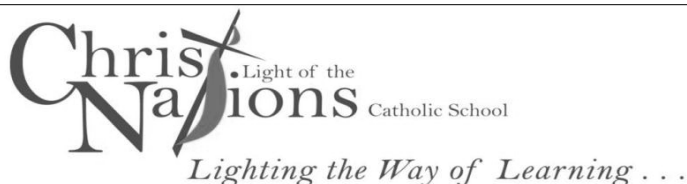
With slight symptoms of cold or flu—

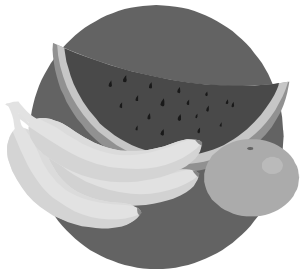

Healthy Habits

The holidays are behind us, we have given up on our new years resolutions and warmer weather is quietly approaching. Yet, there is still time to shed some unwanted pounds that are caused by holiday celebrations and family traditions. Let's get ready for that warm weather, and you don't have to diet to get there. Just make a few simple changes in your eating habits and you will get there.

Have 3 balanced meals per day, with a snack between meals. Balanced meals should consist of 25% protein/meat, 25% starch/carbohydrates and 50% fruits and vegetables. This can be applied to each meal of the day. Fats should be no more than 30% of your total daily calories, and all sweetened/sugared foods should be eliminated, or at least try to eliminate them.

Fiber is very important in our diet. The best way to consume the recommended daily dose of fiber is to eat fresh fruits and vegetables and eat Whole Grain breads, pasta and rice. If you have difficulty eating fresh vegetables, steam them slightly to make them a little easier to chew, but the tougher the better. Whole grain pasta and rice are also going to be a little tougher, but a few extra minutes in boiling water may help.

Snacks between meals should be no more than 100 calories. Examples may be; a banana, JELL-O sugar-free pudding, 1 stick of string cheese, 30 grapes, 3 ginger snaps, and for the chocolate lover, 4 Hershey's kisses. Having a snack between meals, keeps our insulin production at a constant level, we are less likely to feel that mid-afternoon slump if we have a snack 2-3 hours after we have had lunch. Having balanced meals and snacks will keep us from over-eating at dinner or late evening.

One last thing to change would be to eliminate one sugary drink per day. Liquid calories do not satisfy our appetite or control our hunger, but they can increase our production of insulin, which puts us in that mid-afternoon slump. Replace your sugary drink with a large glass of water. It gives us a full feeling if it is taken in before the meal and it has no calories.

It takes 21 days for a something to become a habit. Let's start forming those habits today!

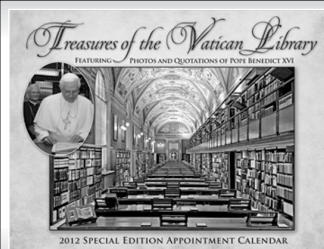

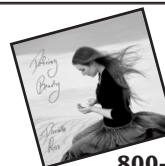
