



Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.



EIGHTH GRADERS ENTHRONE THE SACRED HEART FOR THE SCHOOL COMMUNITY




This week we had our annual Enthronement of the Sacred Heart. This prayer which was led by the eighth graders to renew our commitment to the Sacred heart of Jesus.

LIFESA VING BATHTUB TIPS

Before you lather up, listen up. Bath tubs account for hundreds of injuries and drownings each year. Next to the swimming pool, the bathtub is the second major site of drowning in the home. That's why it's so important to remember these safety measures:

- *Supervise children. Don't leave children alone in a tub for even a minute. Children can drown in less than an inch of water and inf ewer than 60 seconds.*
- *Lower Temperatures. Set your wa ter heater to 120 degrees. 3rd de gree burns can occur from water at 140 degrees.*
- *Install safety gear. Be sure that sliding glass shower doors are made with safety glass. Installing grab bars along the tub or shower can help the elderly or injured sta bilize themselves. Use a rubber bath mat.*
- *Think twice. Don't use electrical appliances such as hair dryers, curling or radios near the tub. They can cause electric shock if accidentally immersed in water.*




