

Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

Celebrating the Seasons of Lent and Easter**Using Your Brain for a Change**

THINK FOR A MOMENT of a time when someone may have said to you, "Stop and think!" or "What were you thinking?!" or "Use your head!" Try to remember who told you this and why they said it to you. Spend some time with one or two incidents or stories like this from your life. How did they develop? Who were the significant characters? What lessons did you learn that served you well or may still be important in your life?

The title above - *Using Your Brain for a Change* - captures well the spirit of such comments we've all heard or said to someone else. It's not a put down, but a positive and forceful reminder that every human being has within themselves the power of reason and will to be different and to be a part of making things different for others. All the more so when we add faith to the way we think about things and how we make decisions.

All of scripture today reminds us that from God's point of view **people are the sacred place where the presence and power of God can and should always be found**. Every place or practice of worship must reflect and reinforce this point of view. Every true commandment or religious belief must shape and strengthen our daily experience of living in God presence and with each other so that the commandments and teachings of faith are written on our hearts. And thus more easily seen and shared with others.

On our journey of faith it is so easy to forget that we are the People of God, the presence and power of God. When we do, we need "**reconciliation**" - to consciously look for how we can "**walk together again**".

AN EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE**FOR THE "RECONCILIATION" OF OUR WORLD**

Use the following questions to develop your consciousness of the need for reconciliation within your family, among your friends and neighbors, and in our community or world. Use them to develop and enjoy the power you have from God to bring about a better world.

- Do I understand and value **the importance of listening** to other people? The significance of genuine dialogue and discussion?
- What difference does the resurrection of Jesus Christ make in my life? How does the resurrection help me to grapple with the questions of everyday life? Do I experience my daily choices as life-giving?
- Do I accept and enjoy the fact that every person and our world is a "work in progress"?
- Do I believe in **the connection between the material and spiritual worlds**? What do they have in common? How are they different?
- How have the material blessings of my life brought me closer to God? Helped me to have a stronger love for myself and others? How have they separated me from God or weakened my relationships with others?
- How has my faith and practice of religion helped me to have "more love" for others? To be about more than my personal salvation alone?
- Do I exercise **the capacity of self-reflection** on a daily basis? Do I value and enjoy growing in knowledge, experience, and wisdom?
- Do I enjoy asking questions? What fears do I have that keep me from asking questions? What motivation do I need to question more?
- As I grow older has my love for others expanded? How did this happen? What hinders it from continuing to expand?
- What keeps me from living more responsibly? During the past year what choice have I made that has helped me grow the most? Or someone else? What is my next choice?
