Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

The Law of Christ

HOW MUCH TIME DOES IT TAKE for grapes to be fermented into good wine? How much time does it take for a caterpillar to change into a butterfly? How much time does it take for a tiny acorn to become a might oak? **Real transformation takes time.** But the time involved is less critical than the change this time brings about.

The transformation to which Jesus calls us in today's Gospel takes a lifetime of time. We learn only slowly to accept the demands of discipleship. We embrace the Gospel challenge because Jesus has promised that those who serve, those who lose their life and die, will be given fullness of life and a share in his glory. This transformation is worth all the time it takes.

"As the redeemer of all humanity,
(Jesus) delivered himself up to death for the sake of all:

'No one has greater love than this,
to lay down one's life for one's friends.'
... by the gift of his Spirit he established, after his death and resurrection,
a new communion of sisters and brothers
among all who received him in faith and love; this is ... the Church."

2nd Vatican Council, Gaudium et Spes, 32

Our human instinct is not to die, but to cling to life. What Jesus asks in this Gospel truly may not be our first inclination, but in Baptism and with continuing attention can become second nature to all of us. To be faithful disciples we must hand over our life by serving, by putting others' needs ahead of our own, and by dying to self-centeredness. In this way God transforms us and gives us a fullness of life and glory that we cannot even imagine. And this transformation is worth all the time it takes.

When I first learned about this kind of love - unconditional love - I was told that this is The Law of Christ. I learned that - truly unselfish love - changes things more certainly and powerfully than any human law could ever hope to do.

Take some time as you prepare for Easter to **remember** how much you've been changed by the unconditional love of someone else. Then try to imagine what your love for someone else might truly be able to accomplish.

"To suffer with the other and for others; to suffer for the sake of truth and justice; to suffer out of love and in order to become a person who truly loves these are fundamental elements of humanity ..."
Christian faith brings forth within us "a new and deeper capacity for these kinds of suffering."

Water Proofing!

The kindergarten class finished up their weather unit with two experiments about water proofing. For the first experiment, the children used a plastic bag, tissue paper, wax paper, construction paper, and a dry cotton ball. The children took the dry cotton ball and placed it under each item listed above. They squeezed a dropper full of water over each item and then checked to see if the cotton was wet or dry.

The second experiment was about how ducks do not get wet. We read the book "Ducks Don't Get Wet" and learned that ducks preen themselves with oil before getting into water. Their feathers never get wet, because oil and water do not mix. We poured blue water and baby oil into a jar. The children watched how the oil sat on top of the water even after stirring the water and oil together. The children also put a little bit of baby oil on the back of their hand. They took turns pouring water over their hands to see how the water rolls right off. The children loved the hands on experiments.



SIGNS OF SUCCESS

The collaboration that has been taking place among the parishes and schools in the Northeast Deanery through our Federation of Catholic Schools is showing positive signs of success. Professional Learning Teams EARN INNOVATION AWARD

Today's Catholic Teacher magazine has selected the Federation of Catholic Schools as a recipient of a Catholic Schools for

Tomorrow Award for innovation with the Professional Learning Teams program. The award annually honors 12 recipients that have

led the way by implementing exemplary, innovative programs to improve the teaching and learning of their students, faculty and staffs.

Professional Learning Teams (PLT) were implemented starting in the 2010-11 school year as a way to enhance academic programs at Federation schools by providing collaborative professional development מכטבמטנכנכננננבניונטביניםמטמממממממל opportunities. All teachers from Federation schools are members of a PLT that either focuses on a grade level or subject area (i.e. kindergarten teachers, science, math, religion teachers, etc.). One teacher from each group serves as the Team Leader to help facilitate discussion and set the group's agenda. Jennifer Stutsman, principal at Blessed Teresa of Calcutta, has provided leadership and direction to the 150 teachers who participate.

"It has been a great success!" said Stutsman. "Teachers went beyond the original meetings to create wikis, develop writing programs between students of different schools, develop a common pre-school curriculum, create a Summer Academy for students with academic needs, and more. Coming together through learning teams has improved the teaching and learning process!"

A group of principals, teachers and pastors will travel to Boston for the National Catholic Education Association convention in April to receive the award on behalf of the Federation.

STUDENTS OBSERVE LENT WITH PRAYER, FASTING & ALMSGIVING

Catholic identity is evident in our Federation schools as students, teachers and staff observe Lent in ways that are both traditional and creative. They also have a Lenten path throughout the school where a different theme (i.e. giving thanks, forgiving, etc.) is highlighted each week. At Sacred Heart, each Monday the school begins its week with a prayer service with the theme "Step Up Closer to Jesus." Students are given suggestions for how to make their Lenten practice more meaningful.
