




Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples begin preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least 6 months before their wedding. Please remember—a wedding date will not be scheduled until the assessment of their readiness for the Sacrament of Marriage has been completed. Contact the rectory for more information. Weddings are not scheduled during the Season of Lent.

Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament is for those having surgery, the seriously ill, the chronically ill, and those near death. If you know in advance that you are going to the hospital, call one of the priests to arrange for anointing at home or church. In addition the sacrament is celebrated at church on the first Saturday of the month after evening Mass and on the third Sunday of the month after 8:00 Mass. It may be repeated as needed.

Faith - It Makes a Difference!?

SEVERAL DAYS AGO WE BEGAN CELEBRATING the “pass over” to which Jesus invites everyone - a **lifetime of change**. Passing over from one way of being and acting to another is rarely easy or quick. It may involve shifts in how we understand relationships, where we place value, and what we desire most out of life. Jesus invites us to relate to one another by serving one another, to determine our values based on his life, and to desire most in life a friendship with him that enables us to give over our life. Jesus **leads the way** and is **always with us** in the word and sacrament of the Eucharist, in the community of other believers who have also promised to become more like him.

Let us pray that the light of Christ will shine in our hearts this Easter. Let us rejoice and be glad because our Savior lives!






