



Protecting Religious Liberty

Keeping Abortion Out of Our Health Plans

Missouri Governor Jay Nixon has until <u>July 14th</u> to decide whether to sign or veto SB 749. This bill makes sure that no one is forced to pay for abortions or contraceptives in their health insurance plans. Contact the governor today. Tell him abortion is not health care and you don't want to pay for it in your health plan. <u>Urge him to sign SB 749.</u> Call Governor Nixon at 573-751-3222 or visit http://governor.mo.gov/contact/.

SB 749 requires insurance companies to let people know up front whether a proposed policy includes coverage for abortions and contraceptives. If people object on moral or religious grounds, the insurer must exclude these items from the customer's health plan.

Though the courts may rescind or hold invalid the recent mandate of the US Department of Health and Human Services, the passage of SB 749 is still necessary, if the rights of consumers with moral or religious objections to such coverage are to be protected. Without this law insurance companies can still refuse to write a policy that excludes these products and services.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Does the scene of the disciples being sent out two by two bring to mind any other scripture? After the flood, Noah opens the door of the ark and sends his passengers out to renew the face of the earth. Certainly, Jesus has the same purpose. The purpose is fulfilled in your communion in the Body of Christ today, and in your being sent from the Eucharist into the world. The sending is so important that our word "Mass" derives from it. In Latin, the last words of worship are *Ite*, *missa est*, which means "Go, you are sent." From that, people began to call Catholic worship the *missa*, or in English, the "Mass." Our English words dismissal, missal, emissary, and mission are all related. We are not sent into the workaday world alone, but in relationship to one another. Some people have acquired the unhappy habit of leaving worship as soon as they receive Communion and therefore miss the prayer, the dismissal, and the solemn blessing that are essential parts of the Mass. The dismissal is a seal on our Communion and reveals its purpose. Thanks be to God!

BLOOD FACTS

- On any given day, an average of 38,000 units of red blood cells are needed for hospital patients in the United States.
- One in 10 people entering the hospital needs blood.
- Approximately 38% of the population is eligible to donate blood, of those eligible, only a small percentage actually give blood.
- In the United States, someone needs a blood transfusion about every 2 seconds.
- The average adult body contains 10-12 pints of blood.
- There is no substitute for human blood, it cannot be manufactured.
- Almost everyone will know someone who needs blood.
- Blood is often needed for traumas, heart surgeries, joint-replacement surgeries, organ transplants, premature babies, leukemia and cancer treatments and so much more.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. What medicines would prevent someone from donating?

A. In most cases, it is the condition for which the person is taking the medicine(s) that causes him or her to be unable to give blood, not the medications. Usually, if the condition is under control the day of the donation, the person is eligible to donate. This includes medicines for high blood pressure and diabetes.

Q. What age do I have to be to donate blood?

A. Donors must be at least 17 years old. In Arkansas, Illinois, Kansas, Missouri, and Tennessee, 16 year olds may donate with a completed Parental Consent Form. There is no upper age limit on donating.


